#### FROM THE RECTOR

#### Are You Satisfied with Christmas? - Matthew 2

Many songs we sing at Christmas are reminders that Christmas time is supposed to be happy. Songs like "Joy to the world" or "Jingle Bells," all communicate that Christmas time is to be a joyous, trouble-free season.

But let me ask you: Is that what you are experiencing this season? Probably not.

For some of us, personal problems are keeping us from experiencing the joy of the season. For others, you feel like one crisis after another has run you over. With such an avalanche of problems it is hard to have a holly-jolly Christmas. Some of us are so busy and working so hard that there is no time for sitting around a fire as a family or, maybe, there is not anything really wrong but for some reason you are just not enjoying the coming of Christmas. It is not providing the emotional lift that you expected. In fact, it is almost depressing. The world does not look like a winter wonderland. It just looks like winter.

Disillusionment at Christmas is not an unusual thing. We get so hyped up with expectations about what Christmas is supposed to be that often the real thing does not measure up, and we are disappointed. What can you do this Christmas to avoid disillusionment? How can you improve your level of joy this Christmas? The answer is found in the story of the magi in Matthew 2. Magi, wise men from the East, saw a star that indicated the birth of a new king in Israel. Wanting to honour Him with gifts, they set out on a journey following the star to find this newborn King. From the attitudes of these wise men and the events that surrounded their journey, we see how we can raise our level of joy at Christmas.

There are lessons to be learnt from this story. What do you seek?

Your level of joy at Christmas is directly related to what it is you seek.

What is it I want to get out of Christmas? What is it that would make your Christmas wonderful and satisfying? Snow? All the family together and happy? A feeling you define as the holiday spirit? Finding the right present to give? Getting the present you have been hoping for?

The problem with all these is that they can leave us disappointed.

The problem is not Christmas. It is in our expectations. We are looking for the wrong thing.

The magi shows us how to increase our level of joy at Christmas by looking for the right thing.

What was it they were looking for? Verse 2 tells us. They came to Jerusalem and said, "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East and have come to worship Him."

They were looking for Jesus.

Joy, for them, was an opportunity to worship Jesus. That is what we need to be looking for and expecting this Christmas - an experience of worship, a fresh glimpse of He who was born King of the Jews. If our goal this Christmas is to worship Jesus, then I doubt very seriously we will be dissatisfied with our experience. Our level of joy at Christmas is directly related to where you look and what you give.

The magi came to Jesus' house bearing gifts. The gifts they gave were entirely appropriate. They gave gold, gift for a king. By giving it they acknowledged that Jesus was and is the King. They gave frankincense, a gift for a priest. This was incense the priests used in Temple. By giving it they acknowledged that Jesus was a priest - the One who would bring us to God. They gave myrrh, gift for the dead. This was a fragrant ointment used to anoint a body before burial. By giving it they acknowledged that Jesus had come to die for the sins of the world.

We ought to give appropriate gifts this Christmas as well. Do not get me wrong, I'm not talking about material gifts. I am talking about more important things. We ought to give the gift of our love and kindness to our friends and family. We ought to give the gift of our help to those who are hurting. We ought to give the gift of forgiveness to those who have hurt us. Giving these kinds of gifts will result in a joyous and meaningful Christmas.

At last month's Parish Council meeting a resident again raised the issue of parking both on the High Street and along to the Tattenhall Road /Chester Road junction. The Police have now issued several advisory notices and they inform us that ticketing will now be enforced on any vehicle seen parked in the Bus Lane/on the white H bars, also parking within ten metres of a junction. This will be in force by the time the magazine is published. Please park carefully.

The Police have informed us that the use of drugs by young people in a large neighbouring village is again on the rise. In the interests of our younger residents here, we are asked to be on the alert for any signs you may see of this so as to avert this migrating here.

Dubious scam / phishing e-mails are again on the rise. We strongly advise that you forward them


to www.actionfraud.police.uk In general they will ask you to forward the contents of the e-mail to the relevant section and you can then delete it from your computer.

If you are unsure when receiving a dubious e-mail we would suggest to all recipients that they always put some key words into a search engine such as Google, or similar, and/or go to the Action Fraud site. It will usually give you a clue, or there may be a specific warning on the police site.

These were recently found on the High Street close by the Notice Board. Along with those there is also a set of keys lost in the Castlefield park area some weeks ago and **still unclaimed**. The Parish Council held its monthly meeting on 7th November in the Barbour Institute.

For the second month, a resident raised the issue of cars being parked in restricted areas and close to junctions. PC Giggs reported that advisory notices had been given out but that in future penalty notices would be given to offenders.

The Parish Council was asked if it would obtain more information on what was proposed in Phase 2 of the Inspired Villages Development and Matthew Morris advised that he would ask their representative to come to a Parish Council meeting in the New Year to bring Councillors and residents up to date.

Hedge cutting on Park Avenue was still required. Cllr Mike Jones would raise this issue with the Highways Department.

Car Fest would take place on 28-30th July 2017. Traffic management would be broadly the same as this vear's event. Tickets for the CH3 post code would be available in the Spring.

#### The Agenda

- The Finance meeting was rearranged for 23rd November at 7.30pm.
- The Parish Council would again provide refreshments in the Barbour Institute, following the Remembrance Day observation at the War Memorial.
- The Parish Council approved draft comments on the Consultation Oil

- and Gas Exploration, Production and Distribution SPD and these would now be submitted to CWaC.
- Draft comments relating to the appeal by Redrow on the Smithfields Development were approved and would be submitted to the Planning Inspectorate.
- The Parish Council had been runner-up in the Community Safety category of the Community Pride competition. The £50 prize would be added to the Play Area fund.
- A first meeting had been held with respect to the request from St. Albans Church that the graveyard be extended. Investigation of the legal position and various other issues would take place before a further meeting was held.
- Re-opening of Tattenhall Station had been discussed at a meeting with CWaC. Our MP had written a letter of support and had also sent information from the Secretary of State for Transport. There is much work to be done on this in terms of fact finding and community consultation and it is possible this could take up to three years.
- An email had been received about the new notices at the Flacca enforcing that dogs must be on a lead. The Parish Council had submitted dog control orders to CWaC a number of years ago, which stated that dogs must be on leads on the Flacca and on the Park. The Recreation Club was entitled to reinforce this message.
