....caring at Christmas with Charity Cards

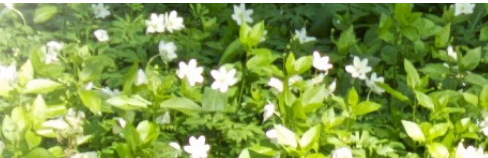
Tarporley Cards for Good Causes shop which sells Christmas cards for more than 30 national charities this year will be in the Crown Hotel, while the Baptist church is undergoing refurbishments. Christmas Card sales are an important source of funding for charities, and they also help to raise awareness of their work. You can choose from a fantastic array of cards and also stock up on Christmas essentials, such as wrapping paper and gift tags.

The Tarporley shop is part of the Cards for Good Causes' national network of over 300 shops which in the past 5 years has raised over £20 million out of which charities have to pay for the production and distribution of their Christmas cards and any VAT. At least 70 pence in every £1 goes to the charities. Staffed by local volunteers the Tarporley Shop will be open Monday to Saturday, 10am to 4pm from Tuesday 1st November to Saturday 3rd December.

FROM THE RECTOR

Time to Remember our Heroes on Remembrance Sunday

Remembrance Sunday is the day traditionally put aside to remember all those who have given their lives for the peace and freedom we enjoy today.

On this day, people across the nation pause to reflect on the sacrifices made by our brave Service men and women. It is a special day set aside to remember all those men and women who were killed during the two World Wars and other conflicts. At one time the day was known as Armistice Day and was renamed Remembrance Day after the Second World War.

November is the time of the year when we wear a red poppy in memory of those who sacrificed their lives for us during wars. The eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month marks the signing of the Armistice, on 11th November 1918, to signal the end of World War One.

At 11 am on 11 November 1918 the guns of the Western Front fell silent after more than four years of continuous warfare. The Last Post is traditionally played to introduce the minute's silence in commemoration ceremonies. 'The Last Post marks the end of the day and the final farewell.

In Tattenhall, we will have the Remembrance Service on Sunday the 13th November.

The service will begin at St Alban's Church at 10.00am and after some prayers, we then proceed to the Cenotaph.

All those who are unable to come to the church but would like to attend the second part of the service at the Cenotaph should be there by 11.00 am.

All are welcome to come and remember all those who have died in our country in times of war.

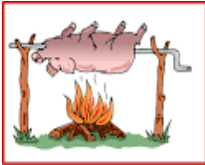

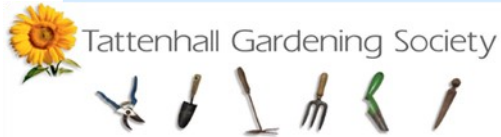
At the end of October a joint visit was made to Harthill with another day at Carol's Garden and lunch cooked by Brian Mellor of Harthill Cookery School.

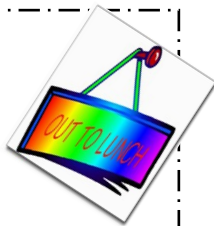

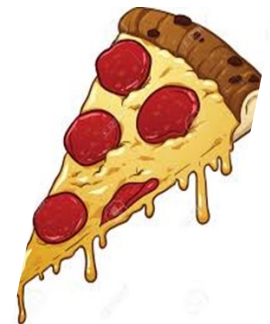

Dear Residents

The Police would like to point out that in the last month there has been activity in outlying areas relating to break ins to out buildings and sheds etc. The Police would like to know about unusual night time sightings you may have observed in the fields of surrounding farms, lamping with dogs etc. Invariably poachers are linked to criminal activity and by reporting any sightings you may prevent you or your fellow residents from becoming a target for thefts.

At the October Parish Council meeting a villager who attended raised her concerns over the parked cars both at the junctions of Tattenhall Road, Chester Road and the High Street. It was also linked to those vehicles parked in the bus lane on the High Street. An attending Police representative gave early warning that enforcement would also be applied to parking within the areas of the bus stops and on the H bars.

He also confirmed that it is illegal to park within 10 metres of a junction and announced that enforcement is now due to start. There will be a 2-3 week period when advisory notices will be displayed and, thereafter, parking tickets will be issued. By the time you read this it will be operating. Please park carefully.

At the time of writing this there is still a set of lost door keys hanging on the High Street community notice board. These were recently found on the High Street close by. There is also a set of keys which was lost in the Castlefield park area some weeks ago (possibly by a young person) still not claimed. This set can be obtained from me. (01829 771641) They have an animal themed perspex key fob attached by four linked rings.

For further updates of when the next Tattenhall Police Surgeries will be held, please call 101. These are usually held at Alison's Café at 12.15-1.15 pm and the Library at 12-1 pm.

The Police always welcome your call on 101 let them make the decision to attend or not, If you aren't sure you can always call HomeWatch 771641 for advice or anonymously **CRIMESTOPPERS on 0800 555 111**. More resources means Police back in our areas and better response times. So make that call on 101 when you feel something is suspicious.

The Monthly Parish Council meeting was held on October 3rd 2016. Amongst matters discussed were:

Parking:

Residents raised safety related issues about parking at the junctions on Tattenhall Road, the High Street and Chester Road.

PC Ged Gigg explained there will be a 2-3 week period when advisory notices will be given and then parking tickets will be issued.

Tattenhall and District Community Land Trust:

At the Special General Meeting, five Board Members were agreed and members voted on a logo.

At the first board meeting Lesley Grainger was elected Chairwoman, Graham Spencer Vice Chairman and Ken Black Secretary.

The Trust will proceed to become a legal entity as a Community Benefit

Society.

The New Park Play Area:

The project is progressing well with Councillors and community members working together. Funding applications have been submitted and the results are expected in January 2017.

Burwardsley Parish Council has donated section 106 monies that are available from development within their Parish towards this project. This is a very generous and welcome commitment.

Burial Ground:

A working group of the Parish Council, St Alban's Church and Tattenhall Wildlife Group (TWiG) will hold their first meeting on 28th October to consider a proposal to extend the community graveyard into Glebe Meadow.

CWAC Proposed Expansion Consultation

Owing to an increase in the number of children in our school's catchment area, there is a need for additional school places to be provided. The Council has agreed to consult on a proposal to expand the size of Tattenhall Park Primary School. This consultation will run from Monday 26 September to midnight Sunday 23 October 2016 and is the first step in the process of a possible expansion. A public meeting is to be held on 17 October 2016 at 3-6pm here in school. The meeting will be a drop in event and will give the whole community the opportunity to discuss the proposal with representatives from the Council. Year 5/6 Tag Rugby Tournament Report by Team Captain Ewan Cawley:

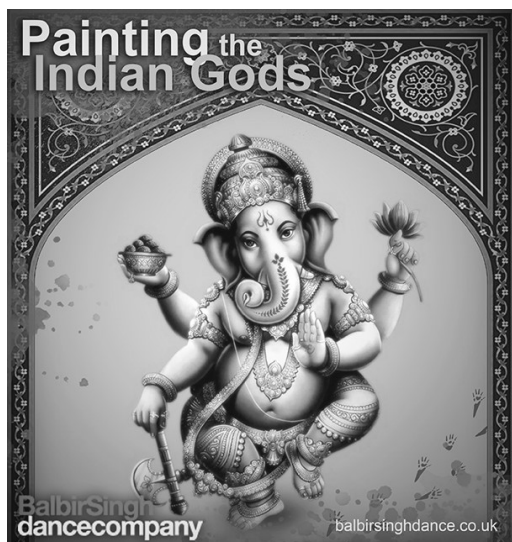
