FROM THE RECTOR

Celebrating Christmas with a difference

Christmas is the most wonderful time of crammed into our schedules, and in the the year to many families. It is expécted to be á time of celebrating with family around a Christmas tree filled with gifts underneath, parties filled with friends and fun, and unique moments of enchantment and joy therein.

But then reality sets in. Family members argue, or choose to stay away altogether. Parties brim with people, yet loneliness surprisingly persists. Moments of enchantment and joy remain elusive in the blur and speed worship as you speak to each other of the whole season.

Christmas also comes with so many fun traditions that we love to take part in, from the additional time with our families we treasure, to the gifts we share, the lights we behold, the Decemberorations we hang, the food we enjoy, and the many other fun traditions our families hold on to.

All of these things are great on many levels, but it is easy to lose the real meaning of Christmas in the midst of all of these traditions if we are not careful. Christmas is about far more than



Baptisms

Tattenhall Church has come a long way in realising the need to make the baptism of your child a sacred, enjoyable and memorable service. The Church of England has a variety of Common Worship baptism services which can be used during a baptism. After careful thought and consideration, the church has chosen one that is inclusive, accommodative and clearer in its liturgical outlook especially for those who are not regular worshippers.

It is from this development that we have set aside the 'Third Sunday of each month for such baptismal services in which we use the new 'Family Communion Service'. We also have the Family Service (without communion) on the first Sunday which is also ideal for such services. If you live in the area or you are in any way connected to families in Tattenhall, please get in touch with the Rector or Churchwardens for baptismal arrangements in the future.

Advent Sunday

Advent is the period preceding the Christmas season. It begins on the Sunday nearest November 30, the feast day of St. Andrew the Apostle, and covers four Sundays. Because the day as it begins changes from year to year, so does the length of each Advent season. In 2017, Advent begins on December, 30th.The word advent, from Latin, means "the coming." For centuries, Advent has been a time of spiritual reflection as well as cheer and anticipation. Even as the Christmas season has become more secular-with advertisers urging holiday gift-givers to buy and buy some more-Advent still brings joy and the observance of ancient customs. Christian families find quiet moments lighting candles in the Advent wreath, and children use Advent calendars to count the days until Christmas.





The meeting on 6th November started as usual with the chairman welcoming any questions or views to be expressed in the open forum part of the meeting.

Questions were asked about the planning application on Chester Road, about hedge cutting around the village, and the Pizza van saga was also mentioned.

Questions and statements were made about the proposed new fencing on the park.

Our local policemen also gave a brief report on crimes committed in and around the village, and stressed that the public should report anything they see or hear to the 101 number.

It was reported that there had been a couple of thefts of agricultural machinery, and also some anti social behavior, with some vandalism to the youth "pod"area. The Police noted their thanks to the Bolesworth Estate for their help in keeping Dragon Hall open.

Operation Shield was mentioned and Ward Cllr. Mike Jones offered £1000 from his Members' Budget to help with delivery of this initiative.

Agenda items such as Planning, the new playground bins, and future plans for the Glebe meadow fencing were discussed. The Parish Council was also briefed on the development of The Community Land trust

development of The Community Land trust, which is slowly gathering pace, and a newsletter outlining the progress would be produced soon.

The Community Safety group continued to work with Highways and confirmed that consultation would take place on speed limits around the parish, in due course.

The Roman artefacts which were found in the earth working for the school extension were discussed, and it was thought by all that they should remain displayed close to where they were found, perhaps in the school.

Finally preparations for the Christmas celebrations were talked about, with confirmation of the Lantern Parade on 1st December.

The Meeting was closed, with the next meeting monthly meeting to be held on 4th December.

We welcome in 2018 with a concert by a truly unique group— The Chameleon Ouintet.

The clue to their performance is in the title - chameleon! The ensemble plays flute, oboe, clarinet, saxophone and bassoon and was formed in 2016 after meeting at the Royal Northern College of Music. United by their ability to double triple the musicians can exchange instruments, often within the same piece!
