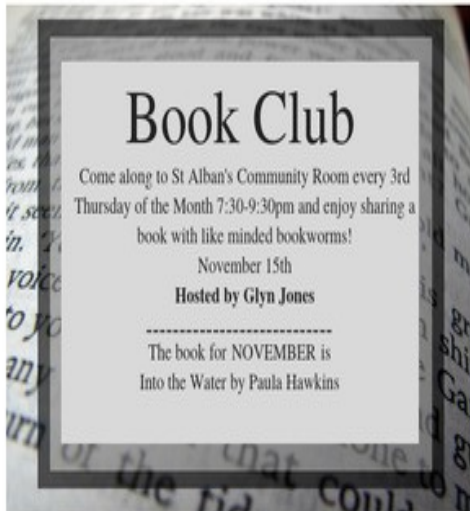

FROM THE RECTOR

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

The eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month marks the signing of the Armistice, on 11th November 1918, to signal the end of World War One. At 11 am on 11 November 1918 the guns of the Western Front fell silent after more than four years of continuous warfare. The Last Post is traditionally played to introduce the minute's silence in commemoration ceremonies. 'The Last Post' marks the end of the day and the final farewell. This year marks the centenary of the end of the war. On this day, people around the Commonwealth will be reflecting on the lives that were changed irrevocably, and those that were lost. Some 65 million men were mobilised across Europe during World War 1. Nearly a third of them, some 21 million were wounded. Another 8.5 million were killed and some 7.7 million were taken prisoners of war. All of them had family and friends whose lives were changed forever by the events of 1914-1918. This year gives us the chance to remember, but also to pray and work for peace, looking forward with hope.

Observe Remembrance Day

People stop work to observe a moment of silence at 11am on November 11, which is the time and date when hostilities formally ended after more than four years of battle during World War I. Poppies are worn as a symbol of respect and tribute on Remembrance Sunday and/or November 11. The day is also marked by events such as memorial services, church services and parades. In Tattenhall, the church will hold a service at 10am in church and is followed by the laying of wreaths at the Cenotaph at 11am.



Tattenhall Commemorates 100 years of the Armistice ending World War 1

The Deputy Lieutenant, Mrs Sarah Callander Beckett DL, is to represent the Lord Lieutenant of Cheshire in Tattenhall, and she will unveil the additional memorial to WW1 to go alongside 'George, the War House' which was unveiled at Tattenhall Remembers in August 2014.

HOW YOUR LOCAL CHURCH (ST ALBANS) IS RUN:

Our church is run by me as Rector supported by a range of volunteers who serve the Church and community as Churchwardens, Deputy Churchwardens and members of the Parochial Church Council. People with a range of skills are needed and help is really appreciated. Contact me or Churchwardens.

At the core of the organisation is the

PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL (PCC) which is responsible for supporting the Rector in the running and management of the parish of St Albans and promoting the mission of the Church.

The Rector is automatically a member of the PCC and chairs the meetings. Other members are elected at the AGM. Nominees have to be 16+ and have been on the electoral roll for at least six months. The Secretary and The Treasurer have to be proposed, seconded and elected by the PCC at the first meeting after the AGM. The Churchwardens are also members. The AGM is usually held in April; it appoints the Churchwardens for the next year and the members of the PCC for a three year term.

THE ROLE OF THE CHURCHWARDEN

A churchwarden's duties are set out in full in Canon Law but are summarised below:

- They form a link between the Bishop and the Parish
- They represent the Laity and co-operate with the Incumbent (i.e. rector, vicar or priest-in-charge)
- They encourage the parishioners in their faith and promote unity and peace among them
- They are responsible for maintaining order and decency in the Church and Churchyard especially during worship
- They are the legal owners of the church's property – i.e. the plate, ornaments and other moveable goods – and are responsible for keeping an inventory of it.

THE ROLE OF THE PCC

PCC members have significant responsibility for the local mission of the Church, contributing to decisions about its strategic direction and use of resources. The PCC is a Charity, therefore members are also Charity Trustees. They accept ultimate responsibility for directing the affairs of their PCC ensuring that it is financially solvent and well-run, as well as delivering its charitable outcomes.(?)

SUB COMMITTEES

The PCC is usually represented on the sub committees but non PCC members also serve. These sub-committees typically meet once a quarter. At Tattenhall Church, we have the following committees:

Standing Committee: Members are Rector, Churchwardens, Deputy Churchwardens and PCC Vice Chair. This group is there to provide support and direction

A time to reflect, think, listen and offer any experiences you may have to help others. Grief affects everybody differently and how one copes is personal and difficult. Sharing can help and time spent at the Cafe can be a comfort.

The next meeting will be on Friday 23rd November. This is an open meeting where those present will be sharing their different experiences.

Autumn Bible Study

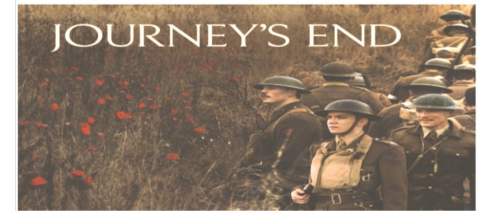
