PARK PLAY AREA An update from the Working Group

As many residents may already know, we had 174 responses from the village consultation from all cross-sections of the public, and feedback indicated that most people preferred play equipment in wood and something in keeping with the conservation area. The vast majority of respondents were willing to wait up to 12 additional months in order to raise money for something special of which the village could be proud.

The group decided to form 3 sub teams: Design, Grants and Fundraising, and each of these teams included a Parish Councillor -Alison Pritchard, Pat Black and Christine Snowden.

The Parish Council discovered that there is a Landscape Architect employed by Cheshire West who specialises in rural playground and arranged a meeting with him. As it turned out he had designed a few of the playgrounds that had come up as favourites in the consultation. The group was impressed with him, and are so pleased that the Parish Council supported our wish to hire him to design the space.

In the meantime, the Design Team met with 4 playground suppliers who specialise in quality wood playgrounds. We put together an ideas board online to share with the architect in terms of our preferred equipment (taking into consideration the consultation feedback),


landscaping inspiration and general look and feel of our ideal design - and all of this is with him now. We expect designs very soon to review and choose from, starting a process that will get us to a final design.

In the meantime, the Grants team has been working away and has received a £1,500 contribution from Great Bear and a £5K MBNA Foundation donation, and is in the process of applying for a Wren Grant for £50K in September. The builders, Seddon, and also Bolesworth Estate, have confirmed they are happy to contribute to the project with either labour for the groundworks or materials.

The Fundraising Team has made great contributions so far in collecting donations amounting to £1K from the TADS production, £250 from the Queen's 90th Birthday Celebration in the Park, as well as many other events in the making.

All in all, we have high hopes to nearly double the original budget available and ensure the whole community is involved in contributing enthusiasm and energy to this project. We still have a way to go, but we're confident we'll make it happen!

FROM THE RECTOR

"A new command I give you: Love one another". (John 13:34-35)

"I have seen the Promised land", said Martin Luther King Junior as he spoke of the dawning of a new United States of America. He was quoting Moses' experience as he glimpsed the biblical Land of Promise. We too have seen our own Promised Land at our own time. What we have seen cannot be taken away from us. Jesus said; "Those who have eves to see let them see and those who have ears to hear let them hear. We are all witnesses of these things. There is only one problem when people approach a new era. This is because what we hear and see does not have the same meaning in our lives and in many cases this causes disunity. But the body of Christ yearns and groans for unity and that unity is inspired and founded on Christ. That unity is expressed, in the Bible, by the Greek word, koinonia. And that word is interpreted Communion. All this is an attempt to express, theologically, the unity in Christ created by the Holy Spirit amongst God's people.

We are witnesses of all this. Nevertheless, we are only an approximation of what God intends. We are a human enterprise trying to be obedient to its Lord and Savior in God's mission. And that should not be a surprise. Only those who have decided that they are God can claim perfection and once you decide that, you behave like Lucifer who decided that his pride of place and appearance made him equal to God. As the English (referencing the Lucifer experience) say, "Pride comes before a fall."

In the midst of all the recent changes in our country following the Referendum, it is time to think about one thing; 'Love and Unity'. It is very difficult to know what God's people are carrying in their heart of hearts following this historical event. There is always one thing a loving community can do. Jesus said 'Love one another and if there is this love among us, then all will know that we are His disciples'. If our intention is to build broken hearts, love each other and focus to the future, then together we build our nation to prosperity. The writer to the Hebrews also imagines the Christian pilgrimage as a race in which we need to

shed all things that would weigh us down. St Paul sees these things that weigh us down as Godless chatter and useless arguments and partisanship. God knows we have had a fare share of such indifferences but He does not want us to live in that era of darkness .We are a disciplined community and nation that have managed to succumb all form of pressure in the past hence we know what is in store for us in the near distant future. As a nation, we are to have such discipline like athletes who work with seasoned coaches to reach the pick of their performance. Only when we have toned our bodies can we strut and show off and compete effectively. In order to achieve this, we have to remain focused, love one another, care for each other, avoid all forms of hatred and lift up the banner of unity through Christ who reigns supreme over all creation.

As we all know, love does not come easy. It is an intentional choice to love and to keep loving even in the face of challenges that makes relationships last. Loving even when your very mind, senses and body say no. In the middle of all our disagreements, one thing I have held onto so dearly in obedience to Christ is that I refuse to be reduced to hate and failure. The Spirit of Christ constrains us to love. It may not come natural but no discipline comes natural. It may hurt, but a very old pop song taught me the double entendre phrase,"It hurts so good"! Yes a true disciple is one who loves even as it hurts and so turns the hurts of the world into wholeness in Christ. All this, not for one's sake nor for one's church, nor even for our Communion but for Christ's sake. When we set such an example we begin to participate in unparalleled ways in the mission of God and begin to model the kind of intentional discipleship that the world so needs today... So let us go forth as free disciples and make disciples of the world!



The Parish Council's monthly meeting was held on 4th July in the Barbour Institute.

During Open Forum residents raised concerns regarding a property on Tattenhall Road which is owned by Sanctuary Housing. The Clerk to the Council will contact Sanctuary about residents' concerns.

Matthew Morris of Bolesworth Estate briefed the Parish Council on the recent Bolesworth International Show. It had not been without its challenges as one inch of rain fall in 45 minutes, during the show. Lots of chipped bark had been put down as a result and more will be put down for CarFest North. Matthew also said that the International had been the most successful so far.

During the main meeting the issue of reviewing our Neighbourhood Plan (N P) was raised. The Steering Group was committed to a review every 5 years and it was proposed to reconvene the original Steering Group, comprising Parish Councillors and residents to progress the review. It was mentioned that the Department of Communities and Local Government had been unclear as to how reviews were to be undertaken.

The Parish Council would contact Highways Department of CWaC as there had not been a 'Ward Walk' for some time to identify issues. There was also an update from the group involved with the proposed revamp of the Play Area on the Park. A Landscape Architect, involved with play schemes identified by the group

as ones they aspire to for Tattenhall, has been working on a design. The Community Group has also been successful in raising grants from MBNA and Great Bear Distribution towards the scheme. A WREN (Waste Recycling & Environment) bid was been put together and Parish Councillors were also seeking clarity from CWaC about s106 monies being used for drainage of the site. The time left on the lease the Parish Council has for the Park is also an issue and the Clerk and a Parish Councillor were meeting with the CWaC officer dealing with this to resolve the issue.

Tattenhall Wildlife Group, with support from the Parish Council, would pursue a Heritage Lottery Grant for work on Glebe Meadow. From consultations in the past, it was known that residents would like to see animals grazing the Glebe Meadow. It would need better stock proof fencing for this to happen again and the HaHa needs to be excavated, at least 2 – 3 feet down. All the spoil would need to be removed and the sandstone blocks uncovered would need to be restored.
