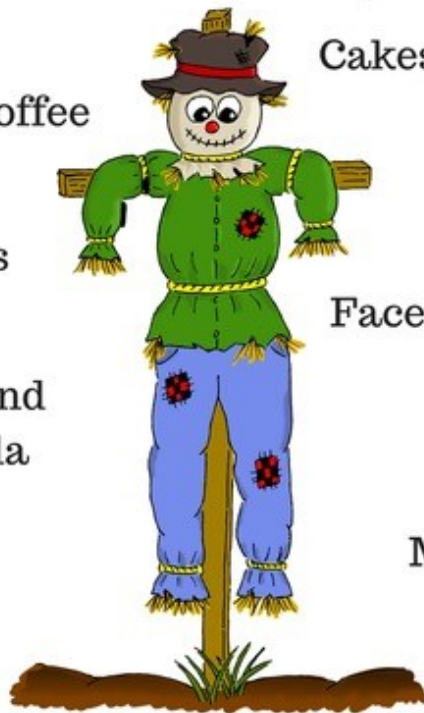

FROM THE RECTOR

MAINTAINING YOUR CONFIDENCE IN CHRIST (Hebrews 10:26-38)

The original readers of Hebrews had been going through difficult times of persecution for their faith. Some were tempted to detach themselves from their Christian fellowship in order to avoid arrest, reproach, and suffering. Moreover, some were in danger of turning their backs on Christianity and reverting to Judaism. In this text, the writer of Hebrews was exhorting them to maintain their faith in Jesus Christ, no matter what kind of trials they might have to face. These words are an encouragement for all believers going through difficult days. They needed this exhortation, especially in view of Christ's imminent return. When Jesus comes again, those who truly believe in Jesus will be on the winning side. Until then, there is need for steadfastness.

As we prepare for our elections here in the United Kingdom, everyone is busy evaluating the candidates, searching for someone in whom they can place their confidence.

As human beings, we evaluate things like experience, temperament, values, education, character and core beliefs. We also tend to place our confidence in leaders with confidence.

We often find it difficult to vote for someone who is insecure or uncertain about who they are, what they believe or what they will do after the elections.

The voice of our culture teaches us that we are to be self confident, that is confident in ourselves. We are bombarded with images of men and women who have perfect bodies, and then led to believe that this is the key to confidence.

Cultural confidence is based upon personal pride, performance and status and power.

What then is confidence in Christ? Biblical confidence and cultural confidence are opposed to each other.

While someone places confidence in someone or something, every Christian needs to face reality that God wants us have faith in Him, and confidence is the product of faith.

God cares for us and wants us to have confidence in Him. We could talk about His omnipotence (God is all powerful; His omniscience (God is all knowing) His omnipresence (God is ever present); His immutability (God never changes), or His eternity (At the end of time, everyone will come face to face with God).

These are all very good reasons to place our trust and confidence in God. God is all of these things and no man is more than these things.

"It is better to trust in the Lord than to put confidence in man. (Psalm 118:8)

Peter Simpson of Rookery Drive died peacefully on 12th April at home. HOMEWATCH



Dear Residents

Last month, our local Police Officers carried out the security marking of bikes in Tattenhall. It was well attended and a considerable number of Bikes were registered. If you have a bike that you would like to register but you missed out on this session and would like to be notified of future events please get in touch with Homewatch. These events are normally held in Delamere.

All that it entails is that a lightly acidic marking paste is placed over a uniquely numbered paper stencil usually on the base of the bike. That stencilled number along with the rest of the bikes details and that of the owners will then be placed on the Police's National Bike Register. This makes it easier to identify and return your bike after it is recovered should you be unfortunate to have it stolen. All carried out for free.

I am pleased to say we have had no suspicious incidents recorded in the area or reported to us last month. However we are coming up to a period when shed break ins some times increase. If you have any suspicious activity around your property please let HomeWatch know for the benefit of the wider area. Also Free security marking of your garden implements is available through HomeWatch. Engraving/UV marking/indelible marking.

With Holidays approaching, while you are away you may want to arrange to

have someone put a car on your drive occasionally, open and close gates, perhaps mow your lawn and check milk, and that mail is not hanging out of your letter box. A radio, TV and light set on a timer to come on periodically, supervised by a friend would also help to avoid intruders ruining your return from Holiday.

For further updates of when the next Tattenhall Police Surgeries or when and where the next bike marking will be held, please call 101. Police surgeries are usually held at Alison's Café between 12.15-1.15 pm and the Library between 12-1 pm

The Police always welcome your call on 101 so let them make the decision to attend or not.

On Monday 8th March, the Parish Council held its Annual Meeting before the monthly meeting.

Iain Keeping was unanimously elected to the role of Chairman, thanking outgoing Chairman, Neil Matthews, for his three years in office.

Vice Chairmen were also elected with Alison Pritchard remaining in post, joined by Jonny Kershaw. The Housing Officer was Carol Weaver, and Councillors were assigned to the Planning and Finance Committees.

Open Forum before the monthly meeting brought up a number of issues: the state of the verge on Park Avenue; the overgrown hedge at the former Catholic Church; and the dog restrictions on the Flacca. Cllr. Weaver thanked everyone who had been involved with the Planning Appeal.

Inappropriate signage in the village was also raised and will be reported.

During the formal meeting, it was noted that no election would be held for the Casual Vacancy on the council. Notices would go up inviting residents to apply and Councillors were asked to consider who might be co-opted to fill the vacancy.

There had been three applications for Community funding. Following discussion, the Clerk would contact the relevant groups with the Council's decisions.

One of the Parish Council's responsibilities was to maintain the Church Clock. It was reported that

the clock needed to be upgraded and Councillors agreed a sum for this.

The Community Safety group would look at the issue of traffic and parking around Harding Avenue, as part of its remit.

New fencing was required on Glebe Meadow and the HaHa needed to be dug out. Ownership of this would have to be established before any work could be done.

All funding for the new play area on the Park had now been secured and work was scheduled to start on 22nd May, with a 7 week schedule, weather permitting.

The Tattenhall Community Land Trust had been registered with the Financial Conduct Authority. A Housing needs survey would be undertaken by Cheshire Community Action as part of this project.

The Community Pride group had held a meeting about proposals for an Armistice commemoration in November 2018. A number of ideas had been put forward but the group would be pleased to hear from anyone who had not been able to attend the meeting.

A Lantern Parade was proposed for 1st December, and it was hoped to hold a Christmas Market on 15th December. Further details will be available in due course.

Did you know that the Parish Council currently has a vacancy for a Councillor?

This is a chance to be co-opted onto the Parish Council to represent the views of the community in which you live, and to make a difference in Tattenhall

Councillors get involved with a variety of projects: at the moment one group is working on road speeds around the parish, and Operation Shield which is a police initiative. There is a playground group which is co-operating closely with some members of the community to rebuild the Park Play Area. You might want to be involved with the Tattenhall Remembers commemoration of the Armistice which is advertised elsewhere in the magazine or there is the opportunity to review local planning applications. Alternatively, you might feel strongly about a local issue which needs to be addressed and becoming a Councillor might be the impetus you need to do something about it.
