FROM THE RECTOR

A Time for Everything (Ecclesiastes 3:1-8) Life is beyond our control.

Nothing lasts forever. Everything comes to an end. One of the most wonderful events of life that happened in our eyes, was the collapse of communism in Europe. All those Eastern European countries were liberated without bloodshed. It happened so quickly and so quietly. It was a miracle. However, the lack of

permanency in human affairs in also cause for pessimism.

There is a time to plant and a time to uproot. There are so many changes in life that we are easily distracted and it is difficult to have a settled goal.

How do we know when to search and when to give up; when to keep and when to throw away; when to tear and when to mend; when to be silent and when to speak?

Perhaps, we have been striving to achieve a goal that is unattainable and it is time to give up.

Maybe we have been struggling to preserve something we consider is valuable and it is time to throw away.

The Christian will be saved from disillusionment by following the advice of Jesus who said, "Seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." (Matthew 6:33)

If we concentrate on doing what God wants we shall have a goal that circumstances cannot affect. If we forget about personal gratification,



recognition and earthly reward and, instead, make it our chief desire to please Jesus we shall be under his control. Submission to Jesus is the way to a life rich in all that matters.

No one described the great unchanging purpose of the Christian life better than Paul in

his letter to the Philippians. He writes, What is more, I consider everything a loss compared to the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them rubbish, that I may gain Christ... Phil3v8.

Paul was convinced that, whatever happened in life, he knew Christ. This was his great certainty. The relationship he had with Jesus was permanent and could not be shaken. He also had a goal.

"I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. But one thing I do: forgetting what is behind and straining towards what is ahead, I press on towards the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenwards in Christ Jesus".

It is so easy to be disillusioned by the ever-changing scenes of life. I am often cast down and discouraged. It is easy for me to identify with the Teacher of Ecclesiastes.

But I am also a Christian and I find the best remedy for despair is to look to Jesus.

A variety of magazine names and publishers are being used by the fraudsters, who also commonly use the names of certified Bailiff Enforcement Agents such "Scott Davis", "Stephen King" and "Mark Taylor". These are names of certified Bailiff Enforcement Agents employed by debt enforcement companies.

The fraudsters request that the debt be repaid by bank transfer. If the victim refuses, they threaten to visit the victim's home or place of work to recover the debt that is owed. Once the money has been transferred, victims are not provided with receipt details of the payment or contact details. Later when victims make enquiries, they'll discover that the debt did not exist, and often that no advertisement was placed. This type of fraud is nationwide. Since 2017, there have been 52 Action Fraud

Reports relating to this fraud. From the reports received, there are a range of different businesses and individuals being targeted.

Protection Advice:

1. Listen to your instinct: just because someone knóws your basic details, such as your name and address, it doesn't mean they are genuine.

2. Stay in control: always question cold callers: always contact the companies directly using a known email or phone number.

3. Don't be rushed or pressured into making a decision: a legitimate company will be prepared to wait whilst you verify information.

During early April there were reports of burglaries in the Malpas / Broxton and other neighbouring areas. Should you see suspicious activity happening in our locality please alert the Police right away on 101 or if preferred, CRIMESTOPPERS in complete confidence for your anonymity. Obituary

12th April 1951 to 11th March 2018 Vicki Park

Vicki Arden was born on 12th April 1951 at Newton Hall, just about a mile from Tattenhall. Her father Ronald, was a dairy farmer and her mother was Rhoda .As a child she was desperate to get a pony and her mother persuaded her father to buy ponies for her and her brother, Richard. They rode round the village and to gymkhanas. Vicki adored hunting and after 18 seasons with The Cheshire, she had 8 seasons with the Tynedale, 12 with the Cheshire Forest and finally 8 with the Wynnstay. As part of her professional career, Vicki worked for Shell at Thornton in the computer department. In 1982, she got married to Alex Park and in 1986, gave birth to their only son Tim. In the course of time, the family left Northumberland in 1990 to take a farm tenancy in Mobberley where they had 14 happy years breeding Holsteins and running a cattle breeding company. Many will know that the weekend of 11 November 2018 marks the Centenary Anniversary of the end of The Great War

Readers may also remember that back in 2014, the Parish Council, together with groups from the community, held a commemorative weekend event Tattenhall Remembers which

marked the Centenary Anniversary of the start of that conflict.

As you would expect, the Parish Council and the Armistice Committee have been busy planning a Programme of Events, which is now coming together.

Without spoiling and pre-empting all of the celebrations, commemorations and legacy projects, here is some idea of what is planned:

The weekend has to be viewed as a mixture of celebration (marking the end of the fighting) but it is right and proper that we are reflective and that there are some long term legacy projects in place which will add to the unique role that Tattenhall played in that period of 1914-1918.

There will be *partying* and *singing* and concerts, which will have a nostalgic theme and TADs will also be involved There are plans 'to dress' The Barbour Institute — last month the magazine featured a request for home-made poppies and you will find a reminder below.



Some projects have already been publicised on

Tattenhall Online such as the funding for two wooden benches to be located at the War Memorial as a point of permanent reflection and Redrow Homes has also provided Tattenhall Local History with £775 from their Community Funds to create

a long-term heritage trail pamphlet. The Parish Council is also funding an historical interpretation panel to be installed near to the War Memorial and War Horse Sculpture 'George', which was so well received back in 2014, will be added to!

Some of the projects are obviously in line with national initiatives — The Commonwealth War Graves Commission has requested that everyone 'gets on side' and all the necessary paperwork has been completed in this respect; bells will be rung throughout the land and be assured that the Tattenhall Bell-Ringers are on standby; Beacons are to be lit throughout the land — and there will be one locally.

Tattenhall Local History has raised the necessary funding for the installation of a 'Roll of Honour in the Church of St John the Divine in Burwardsley which will provide a lasting legacy there too.

So, a flavour of what's in store but without giving all the details away! Look out for more details in the coming months.



Poppy making is well under way in Tattenhall, with some residents exceeding all expectations! To boost the total it has been suggested that the poppies which made up the wreaths laid in 2017 could be re-used. Poppies can be knitted, crocheted, made of material or card—each just needs a "tail" at the back so that it can be attached to netting—and they can be delivered to any member of the WI or Sue Gamble at 14 Barnfield. Remember the WI would like at least one from every household! We are also starting to make a book about the reasons why people have agreed to make the poppies. For example Jan from Tarporley (you do not need to live in Tattenhall to take part) is going to make 61 to represent lives lost in Tarporley in the 1st World War.

Operation SHIELD is a Cheshire Police approach to property marking and crime prevention. The property marking kit is called Selecta DNA which is a marking system unique to an individual address which allows for identification of property in the event of it being stolen, but more importantly is to aid in the prevention of crime and to act as a deterrent.

Tattenhall & District Parish Council has been fully supportive of the roll out within the Parish. One kit will be supplied free of charge to every household and additional kits can be purchased at a cost of \pounds 40 from Cheshire Police.

The aim of Operation SHIELD when it is rolled out in Tattenhall is for it to be distributed to every residential and farmhouse property by a personal visit by a Police Officer, Police Community Support Officer or associated unit such as Community Safety Wardens. The visit will involve a simple registration process of filling in the recipient details on a form for recording purposes only and then the person issuing the kit explaining how to use the kit and the type of items that can be uniquely marked by the kit.

The kit comprises all that is required, with a pictorial leaflet showing 6/7 easy steps to follow, a bottle of solution which when applied with an applicator, also supplied, dries clear and hardly visible to the eve. Also in the kit are 4 windows stickers for placing at visible points where someone might look at the property. There are a large number of round tamper proof stickers within the kit for placing on larger items to aid in identifying that a piece of property has been marked, in the unlikely event of it being stolen, and finally in the kit is a credit card size piece of plastic with the reference numbers which are unique to a property and which allow property to be identified to a particular address.

The liquid, when applied, will last for several years, is extremely difficult to remove once applied and any attempt at removal will leave a significant other mark.



In addition to the roll out of individual kits, there will be a number of street type signs placed at various relevant points throughout the village to indicate to any would be thieves that residents of Tattenhall have marked their property and that the community is being pro-active in deterring crime. The following are examples of the type of property that can be marked, however it is not a definitive list:

- Garden equipment Lawn mowers, Ride on mowers, strimmer's etc.
- Power Tools Drills, Chain saws etc.
- Small agricultural equipment Quad bikes, Rotators, trailers etc.
- Garden furniture Benches, Patio furniture, Barbeques, patio heaters etc.
- Leisure / Hobby items Golf clubs, fishing tackle, Saddles and other tack etc.
- Electronic devices Laptops, I-pads, mobile phones, televisions etc.
- Ornaments Figurines, pottery etc.
- Pieces of furniture, paintings / artwork etc.
- Jewellery boxes, safes etc.

There has not been an increase in Burglaries or theft of property in the area, but it is important to be proactive and preventative with the aim to reduce the likelihood of being a victim of crime.

It is envisaged that Officers and other staff will be visiting each and every address in Tattenhall starting the beginning of May 2018 to personally deliver your own unique kit and explain how to use it and register the kit to you and your property. I hope to see you soon, along with my colleagues PCSO Jon HURST, PCSO Rachael McKEVITT with your Selecta DNA kit as part of the roll out of Operation SHIELD in Tattenhall. At the beginning of the April Parish Council Meeting, with Cllr. Pritchard in the chair, she advised that after 33 years of employment with Tattenhall and District Parish Council, Jean Dutton was retiring, and that evening's meeting would be her last as Parish Clerk. Jean was presented with some flowers and thanked for her support to both the parish council and the community overall. Cllr. Pritchard added that Jean's extensive knowledge would be sorely missed but that she had volunteered to support the handover to the new Clerk. The post had been advertised and interviews would be held towards the end of April.

During Open Forum two residents expressed concern about the increase in dog fouling, particularly on the Millfield and by the church footpath. Most owners are responsible, but a few are giving dog owners a bad name. Signs are in place around the village and comments were made that the presence of 'poo' bags on the sides of the bins tends to reduce this problem. It was agreed that the dog warden would be asked to visit. In addition, as some of the dog bins were very full the Clerk would check the emptying frequency with CWaC. Mathew Morris from Bolesworth reported back on the flooding on Chester Road. Appropriate action had been taken on one side of the road, but the landowner on the other side of the road would need to dig out that ditch so that the culvert could be checked. It was agreed that Cllr. Keeping would write to the landowner as well advising CWAC who might need to investigate.

PC Giggs reported on the theft of 5 pregnant ewes from Beeston –and also that there had been thefts of plant and agricultural equipment. These incidents would require the use of large vehicles at anti-social hours and he urged that people should report any unusual activity. Operation SHIELD would be rolled out in Tattenhall from 8th May; more details are on page 8.

Appreciation was also expressed for the completion of the fencing of Glebe Meadow.

The Parish Council voted in favour of purchasing a dog fouling bin for Keysbrook. Cllr. Weaver reported that there was still no progress to the repair to the verges at Park Avenue which were still rutted. (Correspondence has also been received from a resident on this matter.) Redrow would be contacted. Cllr. Weaver reported on behalf of the Community Safety Group that contact had been made to Highways to enquire when the consultations on the new speed limits may start. The meeting voted in favour of Cllr. Spencer's suggestion that a tree survey of the Spinney be undertaken to comply with insurance requirements. Cllr. Chapman provided an update on progress of the Community Land Trust; a pre-planning application had been submitted to CWAC and that the owners, Sanctuary Housing, were now prepared to sell the land, although the CLT would have to fund their legal costs. Various funding options were being pursued for this. Cllr. White reported that planning for the Armistice celebrations were well underway. It had been hoped to buy some 'Silent Soldiers' for the village but these had now been withdrawn nationally. The meeting also agreed that it would be appropriate to put up flags and/ or bunting in celebration of the Royal Wedding on May 19th. All residents are invited to attend the Parish Council meetings and can raise items in the 15 minute Open Forum at the start of the meeting. Meetings take place on the first Monday of the month in the Billiard Room at the Barbour Institute
