

FROM THE RECTOR

Harvest



The interesting thing about harvest is that people have become more and more keen on celebrating it even though the majority of them seem not to have any idea about growing crops these days.

The Harvest Festival is a festival which most people think goes back into the mists of time. We imagine joyful peasants accompanying horse-drawn carts full of produce back into barns. We imagine the whole village coming together to celebrate that all has been safely gathered in. And a lot of us, quite probably, think back to harvests that we knew as a child. The idea of harvest goes back long before Christianity. Harvest is something of a muddle. Yet we still celebrate it here, and I think that it is right that we should. Let me give three reasons why.

Firstly, it is good to be thankful.

Secondly, it is good to recognize the labours of others.

Thirdly, it helps us to be aware of the spirituality of the environment, and our place as human beings on this beautiful, but fragile planet.

Being a thankful person is part of being whole. For everyone has in them a sense of thankfulness. There is not a culture in the world which does not try to teach its children to be thankful people. To be thankful is to be human.

On this harvest day, let us, meeting as we do, before God, remember that we are a thankful people.

The harvest also allows us to remember that labour of others. Whether it is the virtues of science, or the skills of a team or those who do indeed gather the harvest in the fields. It does not matter. We rely on others for our daily bread.

And it is good to remember them once in a while.

As the years go on, our stewardship of creation is held up to ever greater account. Let the urgency of the need to keep the environment in mind never leave us when we come into church. We rely on others for our daily bread. And it is good to remember them once in a while.

HOMEWATCH



Dear Residents

There have been at least two sightings of vehicles in suspicious circumstances at remote locations. One farmer came across a woman and child in a black Peugeot Picasso touring the lower part of his farmyard, who, when challenged, gave the excuse of looking for scrap. Furthermore in a follow up there have been sightings again of drone aircraft over farm buildings and machinery. This has been reported in the past as a way of observing potential items to steal. With the opening of the new playground area, would residents please report any abuse of the equipment to the anti social behaviour contact above. Older youths have been encroaching into the toddlers' area of the play park which is obviously intimidating, and wrapping the swings around the cross beam.

Whilst the construction of the new school extension is ongoing this is another area to keep an eye on. You can also report problems anonymously to CrimeStoppers 0800 555 111. The large Police activity involving a Helicopter in the Beeston area in early September was reported to be the unconfirmed search for an escaped prisoner.

The alleged dog waste problem on the soon to be fenced off area of the public park has been monitored daily during the six week holidays and there have been no deposits on that area throughout that period. There has however been industrial wrappings and

sharp plastic shards blown over onto the public park from the building area of the school despite the fence.



Robert Roden 1954-2017 (Burial of Ashes in St Alban's churchyard on 31st August)

Robert was born in the family home on the 25th October 1954, Rose Corner, the family cottage in Tattenhall, Cheshire, with an older brother Colin, 11 years his senior. He attended Hart Hill primary school, before being selected to attend the local grammar school having passed his 11+. Here he excelled in Maths and science. Outside of school most of his free time was spent at a local stable yard, working as a stable boy, he also was a paperboy and a bell ringer at the church. Aged 16 he became an engineering cadet moving away from Cheshire, the first in his family to do so, to attend college in South Shields and after four years he qualified as a 3rd Engineer. Working for Pan Ocean Ancho his ships carried chemicals across the globe, sailing regularly to the Far East, Australasia, the Caribbean and both the east and west coasts of the USA. Rob retired about 18

months ago on ill health. Robert was always loyally proud of his children, his family and his friends. He will be dearly missed.

The Parish Council held its monthly meeting on 4th September in the Barbour Institute.

Open Forum was held before the start of the official meeting and the concern for the school fence was raised again. The Chairman will write to the Governors requesting a meeting providing an agenda. This letter and agenda will be placed in the public domain for all to see.

Lance Warburton introduced himself as the new owner of the Sportsman’s Arms and emphasised his wish to be involved in the local community.

A meeting with CWaC Highways Department was taking place at the end of the week and residents were asked to put forward any issues which they wanted to raise with officers.

The proposed Wain Homes development of 30 houses on Tattenhall Road was also raised by residents. The Parish Council was waiting for the documents to be in place before a consultation process could begin.

There had been car parking issues at the Barbour Square resulting in ten more cars parking there which had formerly been parked elsewhere.. Matthew Morris, from Bolesworth Estate which owns the car park, said that the situation was being closely monitored.

He also thanked the Parish Council and the wider community for the

support that had been given to events held at Bolesworth this year.

The options put forward by CWaC in relation to the Local Plan Part 2 concerning sites for future housing developments in the village was discussed. It was agreed to support the building of one group of 30 houses and then rely on small/ individual sites in line with our Neighbourhood plan to bring our numbers up to the required amount.

The new play area had been a resounding success although there had been problems with overflowing bins. This had now been resolved with CWaC. It was suggested that recycling bins might be a future addition.

Hedge cutting was discussed again. The Parish Council would look into finding a new contractor.

The next meeting will be Monday 2nd October.

All residents are welcome to attend the monthly Parish Council meetings as well as the Planning and Finance meetings. Agendas can be found on the Parish Council website at tattenhallpc.co.uk

IT'S OFFICIALLY OPEN



On Saturday 10th September, the new play area in Tattenhall was officially opened by Carys Manson who was the lucky child whose name was drawn to cut the ribbon.

A parade of excited children gathered on Rookery Drive to walk to the play area where Alison Pritchard, Vice Chairman of the Parish Council, made a short speech and then invited Carys to perform the ceremony.

The sun shone in defiance of the forecast; families brought picnics; Mac Bros played live music; and Letters Out provided delicious Pimms and other refreshments.

The games proved very competitive in the sprint, the egg and spoon and sack races and the parents were even more spirited in the tug of war competitions. Each side of the village competed against the other and the 'left' side (Spar side as opposed to Greenlands) was victorious in the men's and women's events!

Redoing the play area was instigated by the Parish Council which had been putting funds aside over a number of years.

A group of young mothers joined the Parish Council working group and were

instrumental in consulting the community over what play equipment would be most suitable.

That same group then set about raising the balance of the funds needed and were successful in obtaining a £50k grant from WREN; £5k from MBNA, and generous donations from local businesses. Face painting, a Ceilidh and a Crowdfunding initiative raised a further sum and the money for the groundworks and drainage came from CWaC in the form of open space contributions from Redrow and from Burwardsley Parish Council.

The project took over a year, from inception to completion, and since the play area was opened just half way through the school holidays it has been enjoyed by many local families. There is equipment for younger and older children, and much of it has been designed with access for disabled children.

Chairman, Iain Keeping, said "It's a fantastic facility for Tattenhall and the Parish Council has been delighted to work with a group from the community to bring the project to fruition".


