

Dear Residents

There were reports of five men in camouflage clothing each carrying cased guns (one gun out, and unbroken) late one evening in the Chapel Lane, Milton Green area last month. Residents are requested to report sightings of similar cases as soon as possible, as suspected poaching can sometimes be linked to other criminal activity.

Intruders have been seen in the grounds of the Rookery late evening leaving the remnants of beer cans and a Ouija board behind.

FROM THE RECTOR

Count Your Many Blessings

What would you do when problems keep you awake at night? Toss and turn? Take a pill? The best advice I have found is to count your many blessings, naming them one by one. Paul did exactly that when he wrote to the church at Ephesus. Consider with him all the ways God has blessed believers.

I. Consider the source of our blessings (Ephesians 1:3). Blessings come through a relationship. God is the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. When we believe that Jesus is God's Son who died on the cross for our sins and rose again and then we receive Him as our Lord, we enter a wonderful relationship with God as our Father. Blessings are abundant. Because Almighty God does the blessing, we are blessed with all blessings. Our God does not skimp. He gives "exceedingly abundantly above all we could think or ask." Blessings are spiritual in nature. The health/wealth/ prosperity gospel pales in comparison to the true blessings we have in Christ. Even the material blessings God gives us ultimately are designed to bless us spiritually more than physically. Blessings are found in Christ. We do not deserve God's blessings. Every blessing we receive is found only in Jesus. This is why we have to constantly count our many blessings. Perhaps Daniel Defoe gave us some good advice through his fictitious character Robinson Crusoe. The first thing that Crusoe did when he found himself on a deserted island was to make out a list. On one side of the list he wrote down all his problems. On the other side of the list he wrote down all of his blessings. On one side he wrote: I do not have any clothes. On the other side he wrote: But it's warm and I don't really need any. On one

side he wrote: All of the provisions were lost. On the other side he wrote: But there's plenty of fresh fruit and water on the island. And on down the list he went. In this fashion he discovered that for every negative aspect about his situation, there was a positive aspect, something to be thankful for. It is easy to find ourselves on an island of despair. Perhaps it is time that we sit down and take an inventory of our blessings.

II. Consider the ways God blesses us (Ephesians 1:4-14).

A. He chose us (v. 4). Every day I am grateful that a farmer's daughter named Glenda chose me to be her husband. Similarly, we all should be overwhelmed with gratitude that God wants us to be His children. He wants us to be like His only begotten Son—holy and blameless, living our lives before Him in love.

B. He adopted us (v. 5). Paul reminded the believers that God's eternal plan of salvation involved adopting us as His children through Jesus Christ. Especially wonderful is the fact that saving us pleased God. It was not onerous for Him to bring us into His family; it was His great delight! C. He accepted us (v. 6). Often I counsel people whose emotions have been injured by rejection. Acceptance on human terms often requires meeting some condition, but God accepts believers unconditionally because we are in the Beloved. While we enjoy and benefit from God's blessings, ultimately God purposes all things to glorify His Son, no matter how painful the prospect, no matter how bleak the future, we can - and should - give thanks unto the Lord, at all times, for all things.

SPORTS NEWS Y2 Football Tournament Report:



The building is of course, also home to many local community groups.

The Barbour is fully accessible with a lift, ramp access, and disabled toilet, along with a catering kitchen and free parking. We are lucky to have a caretaker and an administrator who look after both the building and all who hire the rooms.

You may recognise the building once you're inside; it recently doubled as a bedroom, hospital ward and recruitment office for the recent ITV series 'Home Fires.'

The Parish Council held its monthly meeting on 4th June in the Barbour Institute.

At Open Forum, a resident raised the issue of the continued problem of flooding at the junction of Park Avenue and Tattenhall Road. This had been an issue for many years and would be raised again with the utility company.

David Bish told the Parish Council that he would responsible for the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal in Tattenhall in the future.

He also thanked the Parish Council for putting up the flags and bunting in the village centre but pointed out that the flag had been held with CWaC's Landscape on the Indian Restaurant was upside down!

Another matter raised was that of the difficulty people in mobility scooters have in negotiating the junctions around the village.

Items from the Agenda

A meeting would be arranged with Councillors and TWiG members about Glebe Meadow.

There is a Causal Vacancy on the Parish Council as Tim Charmley stood down due to pressure of business. Tim was a great asset to the Parish Council and Councillors expressed their thanks to him for his time on the Council.

The Audit Annual Return was approved and signed.

A Crime Prevention meeting was to be held in the Barbour Institute on 22nd June. Cllr Weaver would represent Tattenhall at this.

The Community Safety Group reported that traffic counts were being conducted by Highways on the roads around the village. Once these had been concluded. talks would take place with Highways about the speed limits.

White line marking was to take place on Chester Road this summer and it was hoped that Newton Crossroads would also be repainted.

Quotes were to be obtained for repairing and cleaning the community noticeboards.

Cllr. Black reported on progress with the new play area on the park. A meeting Architect and the Parish Council agreed that the group should work with him to produce a scheme. Grant funding was also in progress from WREN and other sources.

Party on the Park was organised and it was hoped that many people would attend .

The Community Land Trust was progressing and would soon become a legal body.

Residents were urged to complete the Post Office consultation on returning the service to Pluto House.

The meeting also touched on the lack of school places at the Primary School and on the Mobile Library consultation which was ongoing.

The next Parish Council meeting is on 4th July at 7.30pm in the Barbour Institute. All residents are welcome to attend. Cllr. Pat Black
