From Father Lameck



Two years ago the village of Tattenhall gave donations to children in Zimbabwe and as usual these gifts took time to arrive.

When I went to Zimbabwe recently, I had the opportunity to see how the distribution of the stationery and girls stuff to three different schools had been received. There was over flowing joy among the staff and their children as they could not believe how generous you are considering the distance between the UK and Africa. At one school, one girl cried as she received her mathematical set, books and pens. She was always borrowing others and never saw this day come. Receiving gifts is a great feeling but we sometimes do not realize what it does to the recipients.

Our lives are fulfilling when we give and share, and that great inner joy comes from helping others to better their lives. Giving provides an intrinsic reward that is far more valuable than the gift we receive. As Mahatma Gandhi said: "The best way to find yourself is to lose yourself in the service of others." True joy lies in the act of giving without an expectation of receiving something in return. The act of giving kindles self-esteem and brings happiness.

If you ask people why they give, the readiest answers offer clues to the mystery. 'God wants me to.' 'I feel better about myself.' 'Others need, and I have.' 'I want to share.' 'It is only right.' A hazy halo encircles these good-hearted answers, and if we bring it into focus, the following seems true: Giving takes you out of yourself. You expand beyond your limitations. When giving results in an experience of love, joy, peace, charity, caring, and self-worth, the process of expansion has begun. You get a glimpse of ecstasy. Ask Your Expert!

The questions keep coming in for Rebecca, as her regular feature passes its second year anniversary.

The question we've selected for this edition is: -

"I have prepared a Lasting Powers of Attorney for Property & Financial affairs. However, at the time, I did not prepare Lasting Powers of Attorney for Health & Welfare. I thought my daughter would make these kinds of decisions anyway. As time has passed, I am not sure this was the right decision. Should I be thinking about preparing a Lasting Power of Attorney for Health & Welfare, now?"

Rebecca says:

It is a common misconception that being someone's next of kin allows them to make decisions on behalf of their relative, in respect of their health and / or their finances.

In fact, for anyone (irrespective of whether they are your next of kin) to be able to make such decisions on your behalf, a valid Lasting Power of Attorney must in place.

Without a valid Lasting Power of Attorney for health & welfare, healthcare professionals can refuse to engage with a patient's next of kin and proceed to make decisions without consulting them. The Lasting Power of Attorney can appoint your next of kin and / or other relative(s) if that is your preference.

The preparation of the documentation can helpfully provide an opportunity for you to discuss the appointment with your chosen Attorney(s) so that they are fully aware of your wishes in respect of things such as what kind of care you would prefer (and where) and in what circumstances you would want life sustaining treatment to be given or withdrawn.

Once the Lasting Power of Attorney is in place, you will have peace of mind that all such important decisions can be made by an individual who you trust and knows you well rather than an external team of professionals.

Without a valid Lasting Power of Attorney, your relative would need to apply to the Court of Protection for authority to make decisions on your behalf. This can be time consuming, costly and burdensome.



The Parish Council held its meeting on Monday 6th March in the Barbour Institute. Bob Blackhurst thanked Councillors for putting a plaque on a bench in the Spinney in memory of his wife, Cllr. Georgina Blackhurst.

While footways at Rosemary Row and Newall Close had been improved to allow a blind resident easier crossing, Church Bank remained an issue. CWaC would be drawing up a plan and costs for this area. Further concerns were raised about parking at the primary school. This would be raised again with the police. An assessment was scheduled to establish whether the roads around the school would qualifty for a crossing patrol.

CWaC would be installing inclusive play equipment at Castlefields play area and might try out similar equipment on the Park Play area.

The new fence on the path from Rean Meadow to Burwardsley Road was raised. The fence was included on the planning application but its position on the boundary was in question.

A number of residents came to the meeting to hear from Manor Farm about the Car Events which had taken place there. It was confirmed that this was a monthly event for which Manor Farm supplied a venue but was not involved in the organisation. It had been reported that cars were speeding on the lanes around the venue but police had been in attendance and a meeting had been organised with CWaC, Manor Farm and Police about this issue. It was confirmed that Manor Farm had no responsibility for the behaviour of drivers once they had left the venue.

From the Agenda:

The Neighbourhood Plan review had been rolled out to Councillors by the working group. The Neighourhood Plan area had been changed by alterations to the Parish boundary and this would be amended in the updated plan, subject to consultation with the residents of the affected properties.

It was agreed to fund an up to date Housing Needs Survey as part of the review evidence.

It was agreed to replace the Parish Council Noticeboard on the High Street as this was in a poor state. The Clerk would work to the approved budget to find a replacement. A meeting had been held to discuss events to celebrate the Coronation on 6th May. While a Garden Party had been proposed for Sunday 7th May on the school playing field, there was a shortage of people to run this event as many Councillors were on holiday. Volunteers would be sought so that the event could go ahead.

Other ideas of a more lasting nature included a Clock for the centre of the village; a mosaic designed by the community, and a King's Walk from Memorial Wood to Dark Lane. The Clerk would apply for a grant to cover some of this expenditure.

The project to install Kissing Gates on some public footpaths was under way.

A working group was set up to look at the Mersey Forest project and make recommendations to the Council.

The Parish Council considered, and approved, grants to various community groups. Full details would be in the Minutes on the website.

The Clerk reported that she was having difficulty in finding an Internal Auditor for the Accounts. Please contact her if you could help in this way.

A Parish Council surgery would be held on 7th April at the Village Market at the Flacca at which residents could raise any concerns with the Clerk.

The next meeting of the Parish Council would be after the election on 15th May.



Parish Council Election Thursday 4th May 2023

Tattenhall & District Parish Council (along with all other Parish Councils) is elected every 4 years and our next election is on the 4th May this year.



• The Council has seats for 15 councillors which need to be filled.

• If 15 people or fewer put their names forward to be on the Council they will be elected but no voting will take place.

 If 16 people or more put their names forward to be on the Council there will be an election with voting.

What do Councillors do?

- Work with others including the principal authority, CW&C.

How to stand for Election?

To stand for the Parish Council you will need to complete an application form which must be signed by two people who are on the electoral register for the Parish Council area. The application pack will be available from Cheshire West & Chester Council (CW&C) or the Clerk to the Parish Council from the **16th March and must be submitted by hand to CW&C by 4pm on Tuesday 4th April 2023.**
