FROM THE RECTOR

"Be Still and Know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10)

"Be still and know that I am God!" is the first part of Psalm 46:10.

Here, the word *still* comes from a Hebrew word meaning to "let go" or "release." The meaning would be best understood to say "cause yourself to become restrained or to let go." In other words, we need to come to a place where we are willing to submit ourselves to God and acknowledging that He is in sovereign control.

When we realize that we are truly incapable of controlling life, we can surrender our will to God's will. It may be a matter of finally saying we trust Him. This will open the door so that we may experience the fullness of all God wants and has for us. After all, He is our Creator and has a perfect plan for us when we let Him orchestrate it. This is how we come to know our God. We can *know* Him by having an intimate relationship with Him.

That does not come from knowing *about* Him, but rather getting to personally know Him by what He says (in His Holy Word, the Bible), recognizing the things He does in our lives, and by way of His Holy Spirit who comes to guide and comfort us. In John 14:26, Jesus says "But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, He shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you"

The word of God says: "I have stilled my soul, hushed it like a weaned child. Like a weaned child on its mother's lap, so is my soul within me (Ps 131:2.)

But the devil comes along and knowing that an intimate relationship with Jesus will break his influence on us, tells us that our greatest need is to get more done! A comfortable place of solitude, where there are no distractions is a necessity. Maybe early in the morning when the whole

world seems quiet, gazing at a crucifix from your favourite chair or watching the sun come up.

Listening to a worship CD can be helpful. However solitude is key, without it intimacy will not happen. When we are soaking with Jesus, the scripture "All of us, gazing on the Lord's glory with unveiled faces are being transformed from glory to glory into his very image by the Lord who is the Spirit" becomes a reality. When we read the Bible, we will learn to recognize the way God talks to us, the kinds of things He says, and the merciful love He offers. Think of the waters raging on the Sea of Galilee. Think of the disciples of Jesus-terrified by the waves and the wind."Though the waters roar and foam" The waters always had a sinister character in Israelite history. Whether the waters of the flood, or the waters of the nations that threatened to flood Israel and wash them from their homes, the raging waters were a reminder of the untamed power of the sea and no mariner until the advent of modern technology could approach the sea without fear-and as the *Titanic* discovered, even modern technology does not render man invulnerable to the sea! But the disciples knew Psalm 46.

What troubles you? Maybe it is your circumstances or job security or perhaps it is your family? Or is it some chaotic mix of "all of the above!"? Do you feel as though you are tossed about by a tempest on the high seas? **Psalm 46** speaks to you, in whatever trouble you may be."Be still!" Martin Luther once said that he was too busy to pray less than three hours a day. "If he was less busy, then he would not need to pray as much!


