

The Rector Writes

What is Lent?

We are currently in the season of Lent but many people would like to know more about this period and what it is all about. Lent is the forty-day liturgical season of fasting, special prayer and almsgiving in preparation for Easter. The name "Lent" is from the Middle English "Lencten," meaning spring; its more primitive ecclesiastical name was the "forty days," "quadragesima" in Latin or "tessáracóste" in Greek. The number "forty" is first noted in the Canons of Nicaea (A.D. 325), likely in imitation of Jesus' fast in the desert before His public ministry (with Old Testament precedent in Moses and Elijah). By the fourth century, in most of the West, it referred to six days' fast per week of six weeks (Sundays are excluded).

Why give up something during Lent?

In "giving up" something during Lent, whether that something is food or drink, a form of entertainment or something else pleasurable to us, we turn away from our selfishness and recognise that God alone will ultimately satisfy our needs and wants Lent affords us the opportunity and and cravings. We acknowledge that we do not and cannot fully provide for ourselves. Everything comes from God.

Along with Jesus in the desert, we acknowledge in the face of temptation that we do not "live by bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God" (Mt 4:4). As Jesus found strength and virtue in facing temptation in the desert, so the disciplines of Lent aid us in strengthening our will and our ability to say no to sin.

St. Augustine famously prayed, "You have made us for vourself, O God, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You". By giving up something during Lent we face our inner restlessness by removing the things or actions we often use to cover up our neediness and give us comfort. We acknowledge that only God will ultimately satisfy us in both body and soul, and at least for 40 days we can place our hope in God alone, trusting that our wants and dreams will be fulfilled in heaven by the providence of God. At the end of our lives we will leave the

gifts of time, treasure and our bodies in the grave until the Resurrection. challenge to live now as children of our heavenly Father, reliant on His grace.



Our architects have drawn up draft plans. which we would like to show you at a consultation afternoon/evening in the Barbour Institute on Wednesday 3rd April.


Members of the Board, our Architects, NWD of Kelsall, and John Heslewood of Cheshire Community Action, will be in attendance from 3pm until 8pm.



War Memorial Lighting

A resident asked that the lighting for the war memorial be inspected as it seemed to be on day and night.

Bolesworth Estate Update

Matthew Morris confirmed that the Estate was working with the police, CW&C licensing and the local MP to prevent the repeat of serious incidents at Car Fest. Mr Morris reported that it was taking up to 8 weeks for CWaC officers to be allocated to planning applications, and that the delay risked businesses hoping to invest in the area looking elsewhere.

Having met with a visually impaired resident of the village Mr Morris was shocked at the issues with dog fouling in the village and confirmed the Bolesworth Estate would do all it could to support the Green Dog Walkers Scheme.

Smithfield Pond

Concerns were raised about the management plan for the pond now that Redrow had almost completed their building works.

It was noted that the pond is a valuable wildlife resource and previously Tattenhall

Wildlife Group (TWiG) had spent a day each year clearing and tidying it with residents and would be happy to continue doing this. Due to the pond containing great crested newts not a lot can be done to it.

20mph Signage

A resident requested that the 20mpg signage is moved back beyond the bend from the war memorial towards Tattenhall Hall where the wall had previously been damaged.

It was suggested that the 20mph should be introduced on Park Avenue where there has been a significant increase in traffic and is seriously dangerous.

- . The Parish Council awarded monetary grants of £500 or less to 15 local organisations which had made a formal application. The total amount of grants awarded was £6298.69. Councillors were pleased to be able to support so many community groups.
- The Minutes of each Parish Council meeting can be found on the website. These contain a full report of each meeting's business. For residents without internet access, the Clerk can supply a hard copy of the Minutes on request.



The Parish Council is looking for individuals, groups and businesses in and around Tattenhall who would like to be included in our Squirrel Trail this summer. People can create their own squirrels from waterproof materials, as they will be displayed outside, or can opt for a wooden 'cut out' squirrel which can be painted and decorated. A marine ply cut out can be obtained from the

Parish Council.

All squirrels must be registered and will be included in a trail leaflet which will be available to buy in Tattenhall. All funds raised will go to the Air Ambulance Service which provides a valuable service to people in the rural area.
