FROM THE RECTOR

Celebrating 20 years of Ministry

"With God everything is possible" (Mathew 19:26)

Sunday 28th August 2016 will forever be a Sunday to remember as I saw a multitude of people filling our beautiful church of St Alban's. This was a service to celebrate my **twenty years**of ordained ministry which started with my first three years of seminary life in 1994. We had visitors from all over England who came to witness not only my 20 years of ordained ministry but also the celebration of our new community room (The Vault). It was a day that will go down in memory lane for centuries to come. We were also able to witness angelic singing from Zimbabwe National Anglican Fellowship.

My ministry started in 1994 when I was still working as a policeman in Zimbabwe. I can still remember quite well the morning I felt the spirit of making this important decision of my life. Despite my busy schedule with the police force, I had time to serve God in my parish as a Lay Leader but somehow, this was not enough as I saw many of our parishioners going without a priest for two months. At the same time, the police had no chaplaincy ministry which even made it worse when we needed such spiritual services. I just felt that God was calling me to serve these two ministries and thus applied to the Anglican Bishop with a view of being considered for ordination training. In 1993, I went for the selection conference and was accepted for ministerial training from 1994-1996 at the seminary, "Bishop Gaul College" in Zimbabwe. After my training, I was sent back to the Zimbabwe Republic Police where I was appointed Deputy Chaplain General for the police force. I was to be part of this organisation for the next seven years during which I managed to establish the chaplaincy section and recruited ministers from all denomination so as to have a fair representation of all faith denominations in the police force. This was to be the beginning of the first Police Chaplaincy in our country which I served with a sincere and contrite heart. In 2001 and during the height of political tensions in our country, I tendered my resignation to the Commissioner of Police and left the police for full time ministry in the Anglican Church. I can remember the commissioner asking me if I was going for greener pastures somewhere in the country and my response was a surprise shock to him when I said; "No, Sir, am actually going for hay". In February 2001, I was appointed Dean of the Anglican Cathedral for a year before moving to the biggest Anglican parish in our country; Highfield Parish. In the course of time, I was elected Canon of the Cathedral and later Archdeacon of Harare. I also sat in various

committees such as Standing Committee Senate, Liturgy and Worship and Evangelism. Having been the chairman of the Seminarians for over two years during my training period, I developed a passion for looking after our Seminarians at the Theological College and thus the bishop finally appointed me to be the Chairman of the fundraising committee. I enjoyed my ministerial work and executed my vocational duties with passion. In 2003, I left Zimbabwe for the United Kingdom and finally settled here in Tattenhall in December 2004. My life and ministry in this country has been my source of inspiration and encouragement. As more and more people come to faith in the parishes that I look after, I am encouraged to do more for Christ. I do have a passion for this ministry and give all the glory to the one who called me. God has also given me a team of hard and dedicated Christians who will leave no stone unturned in order to achieve our goal and together we are a team of faithful servants. For the past ten years, we have worked so hard changing the face of the church and transforming lives for Christ. The last five years has also seen the construction of a new community room in Tattenhall (The Vault) which is used by both members of the church and community. This has always been my dream to leave a legacy for those to come after us. As I celebrate my 20 years of ministry this year, I give praise and honour to the Almighty who has walked with me all these years and seen me through all the hurdles of life. I am also very grateful that the Church of England has realised my gifts and appointed me in a number of committees.

All these responsibilities are an honour and a blessing from God who makes all this possible through His grace. It is only through His grace that I am able to do all His work at that level and also being in charge of three parishes under my wing; Tattenhall, Burwardsley and All Saints Handley. All I have to do is call upon His name because He is my Ebenezer, 24/7. God has been my pillar and strength. As I celebrate these wonderful years of ministry, I am reminded by the words of St Paul; "I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow.(1Corinthians 3:6). Although I have worked hard doing all what a human eye can see, it is God who makes it possible. Many thanks to my family, church family and friends who have stood by me all these years. May God bless you all.



The Chairman welcomed everyone to the September meeting, and then after the

usual formalities, went into open forum, when anyone in the audience can ask a question of the Parish Council about a matter of concern.

One of the topics raised by a couple in the audience was that of overgrown hedges, notably on Tattenhall Road just beyond the Keys Brook, and at the end of Park Avenue.

Matthew Morris gave an update on the post office building, and said that we would see some work on the building starting soon.

Andrew Hull from TwiG reported that a working group had removed all the ragwort and brambles from the Glebe Meadow and Barnfield sites. He also mentioned that there had been some fly tipping on the Glebe Meadow, about which CWAaC had been informed.

It was also reported that **Brian Jarrard** had won the Parish
Council's Horticultural cup for all
his work at the Recreation Club in
maintaining the cricket square and
outfield.

John Seiler from CWaC came to present plans for the new play area and everyone thought the proposed new facility looked great. Some financial support from local businesses had been obtained as well as a grant from MBNA.

The group was in the process of putting together a WREN bid and this, together with S106 funding should cover the cost.

The Parish Council is still looking for an Internal Auditor. If anyone is suitably qualified, and would like to help, please get in touch with the clerk.

As always, there were a few planning applications which were discussed, and the appropriate comments will be submitted to CWaC.

The community safety group reported that they have had a positive response from CWaC with regard to a change in speed limits to the surrounding areas, a consultation will be prepared to move this forward.

The future of the Graveyard and its potential extension was briefly discussed, but as it is such a big issue, it was decided to consider in greater detail at a separate meeting.

The Chairman thanked all for attending, and brought the meeting to a close.

The date for the October meeting is 3rd October 2016 at 7.30pm in the Barbour Institute.


