FROM THE RECTOR

UNTO US A CHILD IS BORN (Isaiah 9:6)



A child has been born, and that child is Jesus, the Christ, the Son of the Living God. Trust him, and you will find hope and strength.

As we enter into the season of Advent and Christmas and participate in the joyful celebration associated with this festival, let us not lose sight of the paradoxical message that the Christ Child bring us. May God grant us his grace to see this "true light that lights every person who comes into this world.

The Rector and Churchwardens wish you all a Merry Christmas and a prosperous New Year.

We enter the season of Advent and Christmas this year in a land that has undergone significant political changes. The world or the society we live in intrudes into religion and religion permeates society and is called to make an impact for good.

Merry Christmas to you all.

The Gospels bring out this historical-political dimension clearly, in situating the nativity in a given historical framework with an Emperor, a King and a Governor, each playing a role in the overall narrative. The central event in this narrative is the incarnation. God is sending his Son in the form of a tiny helpless baby, born of a peasant girl and her carpenter husband to bring a message of hope and of redemption to the entire world.

Learn More About Your Church Finances

Church funding is a mystery to many people. It is frequently assumed that the Church of England is funded by the government, or paid for nationally out of huge reserves. This is not the case and the truth is far more complicated. It is therefore vital that time and effort is committed to reminding and advising people of the reality that the living Church has to fund itself. On the positive side, once people understand this simple fact they more readily appreciate the need to give generously and to ensure the continuation of ministry and mission.

The heart of the Church of England is its parishes. Parish finances are the responsibility of the **Parochial Church Council**, which receives money in and pays money out. Income arises from giving, legacies, fees, etc. Expenditure includes building maintenance, ministry resources, and parish share or quota.

What is Parish Share and where does it come from?

Parish Share is the sum of money contributed by each parish every year to the diocese to support local ministry. The Common Fund is the total of all parish shares in the Diocese of Chester. Parish Share is not about our buildings; it is not even about our bishops. Rather, Parish Share funds the lion's share of the cost of our parish clergy as they serve in our parishes; the rest comes from wealthier dioceses

We need to face a hard truth. Fifty years ago around three quarters of the cost of Anglican clergy was met by the Church Commissioners in London. Today much the same proportion is met by the few faithful people in church on Sunday, Friends of the Church, legacies e.t.c. If we fail to pay our parish share, the diocese will subsequently withdraw the services of a resident priest in our parish and we begin to share a priest with another parish.

Every parish contributes to this Parish Share/Common Fund and every parish also receives from the fund in the following ways:

- parish priest's monthly stipend
- clergy pension contribution
- National Insurance
- housing costs
- clergy training
- administration of the Diocese
- the wide range of diocesan support services e.g. the Education Department, which supports local Church and community schools.
- Parish Share is essential to the mission of the church in the diocese, without it clergy could not be supported. The Parish Share or Common Fund is the diocese's largest single income stream.

How is the Parish Share Calculated for each Parish?

The total amount of Parish Share required each year by the Diocese is divided between the parishes in a way that seeks to recognise the need for some parishes to be financially supported by others. How much each parish contributes is based on church membership and the socio-economic category of the parish, determined by the parish itself.

What Can You Do To Support

Each Sunday we celebrate (and receive afresh) His greatest gift in Jesus. God's abundance is for all. In difficult days no one in Israel went hungry as God fed His people with the manna; no one had too much. Giving is not always about money but every single gift that can sustain the life of your church. You may not be a regular church goer but you have the desire to support the existence of your local church. I urge you to become a **'Friend of the Church'** where you can support through a one off annual donation. (*contact the Rector for more information*) You may be a Christian who would like to give monthly but have no time to come to church every Sunday. Get in touch with the **Rector or Treasurer** who will give you a standing order form which allows you to contribute to the Parish Share even when you are away. Your support for your local church is vital for the future life of our churches. For more information, please get in touch with the Treasurer or Rector.

Advent Sunday

Advent is the period preceding the Christmas season. It begins on the Sunday nearest November 30, the feast day of St. Andrew the Apostle, and covers four Sundays. Because the day as it begins changes from year to year, so does the length of each Advent season. In 2018, Advent begins on 2nd December. The word advent, from Latin, means "the coming." For centuries, Advent has been a time of spiritual reflection as well as cheer and anticipation. Even as the Christmas season has become more secular-with advertisers urging holiday gift-givers to buy and buy some more-Advent still brings joy and the observance of ancient customs. Christian families find quiet moments lighting candles in the Advent wreath, and children use Advent calendars to count the days until Christmas.

The monthly meeting was held in the Barbour Institute on 5th November.

During the Public Participation session, Matthew Morris from Bolesworth Estate said he would like to make clear to everyone that the Estate does not own land behind Grakle Croft.

- An Extraordinary meeting of the Parish Council would be held on 19th November to discuss the detailed planning application for this site.
- The Clerk reported that no information had yet been received about the application to make the Bear & Ragged Staff a community asset.
- A meeting had been held with Parish Council, school and community representatives to discuss the way in which the new community room at the school could be used. The meeting was hopeful that a workable way forward could be found.
- The Chairman had requested a meeting with the Senior Manager for Planning and Strategic Transport to discuss housing numbers for Tattenhall. She had replied that a meeting was not required as the

Parish Council had made its position clear. The Council was disappointed with this response and would submit a list of questions which it still wished to ask.

- A report on the Community Land Trust stated that the plans drawn up had not met with the approval of Planning but when completed it was requested that the Parish Council submit the Planning Application.
- The new bus shelter on Tattenhall Road was being installed.
- Dog Fouling was still an issue in Tattenhall and again, Councillors appeal to all dog owners to pick up after their pets.
- The Parish Council registered their thanks to Andy Smith, the local craftsman who was responsible for creating George, the Horse of War, and the new sculpture which would commemorate the Armistice.
- The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Monday 3rd December at 7.30pm in the Barbour Institute.
