## FROM THE RECTOR

**And Simon Peter answered Him, "Lord to whom can we go?" (John 6:68)**

Are you at 'A Crossroads' In Your Life? It means more than you realise. Occasionally we get to a point in our lives where we see the path diverging in front of us. Sometimes it is more dramatic than that and we find ourselves at a clear crossroads – parting ways, evident choices, decisions that cannot coexist.

These points can be critical, or they can just seem critical. The specific metaphor of being at a crossroads is an interesting one and there is some very unique mythology that goes along with it. My suggestion here is that this mythology is not something to be ignored. In my experience, myths are lies that tell the truth. So if you are feeling quite specifically like you are standing at a crossroads in your life, knowing the mythology associated with crossroads might help you to find your best path.

In folklore, crossroads were intimately connected with witches. In Greece, the goddess Hekate was the goddess of occult magic (amongst other occult things) and of crossroads. At a time where the gods were seen to have a direct influence on virtually every aspect of your life, this meant that people were conscious of a danger apparently inherent to being at a crossroads. This theme carried on into medieval England, where crossroads were where witches gathered to work their necromantic arts. As we came into the age of the enlightenment and now beyond into an age dominated by Christianity, science and reductionism, the mythology behind crossroads has been forgotten in our conscious minds. I believe, however, that this mythology and the occult danger present at crossroads remains in our unconscious.

While at your crossroads, what sorcery are you secretly hoping to find to help you make your mind up? Simply holding these questions in mind can provide a relevant perspective on your own position and potentially help you make a decision. At these crossroads are you going to move forward positively with these influences or are you going to leave them behind? If we pause for too long, frozen by fear or indecision, what dangers are we exposing ourselves to? Spending time mulling over options, thinking about all the possible outcomes and worrying about all the possible risks of choosing the wrong path can affect your mental health. Those times when you have lost sleep mulling over possibilities can be debilitating and the risk of becoming depressed because we do not think we can make the right decision is very real.

So if you feel yourself currently at a serious crossroads in life, think about such people like Simon Peter who had to make decision that gave him eternal life. Jesus turns to the twelve and asks if they are leaving also since they were struggling with what He had said to the crowd. Simon Peter answered Him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have words of eternal life. "We have believed and have come to know that You are the Holy One of God." To whom shall you go? Jesus is the only path to God.

At the end of the narrow path you will find eternal life! Life is about choices and life is about the freedom to make choices. God loves us so much that HE did not take that ability to choose away from us. In Deut 30:19-20 God told Moses to tell the people that they needed to choose who they were going to serve. God said that life would be found in obeying Him.

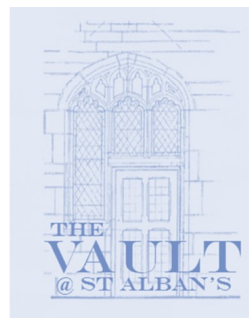

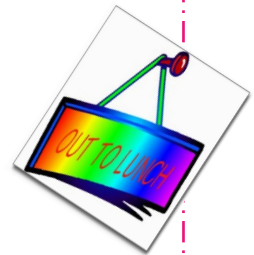

The Parish Council held its monthly meeting on 7th March.

During Open Forum, when residents have the opportunity to raise issues with councillors, PC Ged Gigg reported on an initiative being rolled out called Operation Shield which is a unique property marking system which can help the police identify recovered items to a particular property. For individuals, the cost would be approximately £40 but discounts are available for 'bulk buying' and the Community Safety Group will assess if this is something which would be of value to Tattenhall.

Matthew Morris of Bolesworth Estate also used Open Forum to advise that the fire damaged barn at Whitehead Farm, Burwardsley Road will come down shortly. He also reported that during CarFest North the organisers are actively looking at a safe walking route from Tattenhall to the event and has assured residents that traffic going to the Bolesworth Internation Horse Show will no longer use Frog Lane.

The Clerk reported that she had received two quotes for grass cutting around the village. It was decided to continue with the contractor used over the last few years. He will also be asked to quote for renewal of some fencing

around The Spinney and near the Spinney bridge.

Community safety issues were raised at the Open Forum. The worries over speeding traffic past the school will be addressed with re-examining the possibility of a speed limit restriction and/or provision of a controlled crossing. Cllr Spencer spoke about the decision of CWaC to remove the Communities Fund part of the New Homes Bonus.

There will now be a substantial loss of funding for local projects not only for Tattenhall but also other rural communities including Malpas and Tarporley. The Parish Council will work with other local councils to try and have this decision reversed.

Following a letter from a resident and verbal reports to several Councillors, Inspired Village are to be approached about the destruction of the daffodil bulbs on the grass verge in Frog Lane. The developers will be asked to reinstate the verge and daffodils.

A meeting will be called to progress the Queen's 90th Birthday celebrations. A picnic on the Park is planned on June 12th.
