FROM THE RECTOR

Each year, when we start talking about Lent and Easter, we hear a familiar questions.

What is Lent? Is it an official Christian holiday? Was it instituted in the Bible? What does it mean to observe Lent, and are Christians "required" to do so?

Lent is the span of time in the church calendar that starts with Ash Wednesday and ends with Easter Sunday.

Ash Wednesday commemorates the beginning of Jesus' 40-day fasting and temptation in the desert, and Easter Sunday commemorates Jesus' resurrection from the grave after his crucifixion.

Lent, then, is generally observed as a time for Christians to reflect, repent, and pray as a way of preparing their hearts for Easter. It is commonly observed by many Christian denominations; Catholic, Anglican, Lutheran, and others. Because Lent is not officially instituted in Scripture, observing it is not in any way a "requirement" for other Christians. However, Christians from many different theological persuasions choose to observe it as a way of focusing their thoughts on Jesus Christ during the Easter season.

- On the first day of Lent (Ash Wednesday), some Christians mark their foreheads with ash as a symbol of sorrow and mourning over their sin. (See Job 42 for an example of ash used as a symbol of repentance.)
- **Special** services are held to mark this moment.
- Some Christians choose to give up a habit or behaviour during Lent as an exercise in prayerful self-denial. This might range from something as simple as not drinking beer during Lent to a full-blown program of fasting.
- Some Christians commit to a special devotional activity during Lent—for example, daily Scripture reading, regular prayer for a specific person or topic throughout Lent, or volunteer work in their community.

Whether you observe Lent in a small or major way, you'll be amazed at what happens when you devote a part of each day to reflecting on Jesus Christ and God's Word.

We invite you to take a look at our own Lenten resource this year at Tattenhall Church and to consider other ways that you can deepen your relationship with Jesus over the coming weeks of Lent. Whether you call it "Lent observance" or "daily devotions" or anything else, time spent reflecting on Jesus Christ is time well spent!



LENTEN COURSE 2017

All parishioners from our three parishes are **Session 3** invited to the Lenten Course 2017 which commences on Wednesday 8th March 2017

Venue- The Vault Tattenhall

Starting Time-8pm Many of us give up certain things for the forty days of Lent, and doing so can be a very beneficial thing for our spiritual life. This five-week series commencing on the **Wednesday the 8th March 2017** takes that idea one step further and talking each week about things that God wants us to give up, not just for forty days, but forever. All are most welcome including those who normally do not worship with us. Here are the topics to be covered in summary.

8th March Giving Up Session 1 Genesis 2:15-17, 3:1-7; Control **Matthew 4:1-11**

Adam and Eve disobeyed God, thinking that they knew better than him, with disastrous consequences. While being tempted in the wilderness, Jesus denied his own impulses and followed God's will.

Session 2 15th March Giving Up **Expectations** Genesis 12:1-4a; John 3:1-17

Abraham followed God's call to leave his homeland and travel to the place that God had promised his descendants, even though he didn't know how it would all work out. When Nicodemus is talking to Jesus, he has a hard time understanding what God's grace is really about because he is used to thinking in terms of religious structure. Sometimes we just cannot know what is going on or what is coming next.

22nd March Giving Up Superiority John 4:5-42

Jesus broke all kinds of social conventions by speaking to a woman in public, a Samaritan no less, whose own life was such a mess that it could have really messed up Jesus' reputation as a holy man. But Jesus brought his message of grace and freedom to the woman, knowing that in her humility, she would actually hear and respond, while the religious people were too busy and selfimportant to hear.

29th March Giving Up Session 4 Luke 19:37-44 Enemies

Loving our enemies can sometimes feel like as idealistic a notion as instantaneous world peace, but Jesus showed us that caring even for those who persecute you is a real, actionable mandate that we can carry out by following Jesus' example. Peace is not just a far-off fantasy. Jesus wept over Jerusalem because the people following him misunderstood his message to be about peace in Heaven instead of on Earth. **Session 5** 5th **April Giving U**

Giving Up Popularity Matthew 21:1-11 (Palm Sunday)

What a welcome Jesus got as he entered Jerusalem. "Hosanna!" the people cried, hailing him as an honored king. The crowds loved Jesus on Palm Sunday, but just a few days later a different crowd was calling for his death and the release of a murderer. Popularity and acclaim in the eyes of others is fleeting, and if we put all our faith in it we will be very disappointed.

MOTHERING SUNDAY- 26TH MARCH

Mothering Sunday is celebrated in UK in the fourth Sunday of Lent in honour of

Mother Mary and now, all mothers. It has come to be celebrated in a similar fashion as Mother's Day is celebrated in the United States though the date of the festivals differs. Additionally the history of Mothering Sunday in England and the reason for celebration differs from that of Mother's Day festival in United States. Similarity between Mothering Sunday in UK and Mother's Day in US can be seen in the way the festivals are celebrated today. As in the case of Mother's Day, on Mothering Sunday people give flowers and gifts to their mothers and show their love and gratitude towards them. All are invited.

Hilda Drake - 92 years

The staff have consulted with a range of experts including the local authority, First 4 Maths and Literacy Consultant, Ruth Robson There are other projects which will be developed throughout the year.

The Parish Council held its February Meeting on Monday 6th February in the Barbour Institute.

Three areas of concern to residents that have been on the Parish Council agenda for some time are: The Hedge on Park Avenue/Keysbrook that requires cutting; Flooding at the iunction of Tattenhall Road/Park Avenue; and the shrinking pond on Chestnut Grange. An Enforcement Notice had been issued through the Estate Agent re the hedge; a designated officer from Highways Department at CWaC had been assigned to the flooding problem; and we were told that 'the filling in of the pond was only temporary'. Hopefully, all matters are on their way to being resolved.

A **Parking Strategy Drop-In Session** had been arranged for Thursday 9th February between 3.30pm and 6.30pm in the Barbour Institute. There would be an opportunity to view the plans for the expansion of the Park school on Friday 17th February between 3.30pm and 6pm at school.

Community Safety Group

Cllr Weaver reported that the group had plans for consultations within the village on implementation of further speed limits on the access road;, for the implementation of 'Operation Shield' (Bolesworth Estate would be willing to make a contribution to the signage for this initiative); and to discuss the updating of the CCTV cameras within the village.

Maintenance

Repairs to the fence by the Spinney Bridge are in hand. Glebe Meadow fence bordering the Spinney Path also needed attention - a meeting would be arranged to move this forward.

New Play Area

A grant of £50,000 had been awarded by WREN and so now all the funding was in place. The Parish Council congratulated the Fund Raising Group on their work.

Tattenhall Road Railway Station

Discussions were taking place with Arriva Trains, the Bolesworth Estate, a Government Minister and our local MP, Antoinette Sandbach.

A business case for the re-opening of the station was being formulated for submission as soon as possible.

The Boundary Commission was conducting an Electoral Review, necessary because of changes to our population and housing distribution. Any changes made would come into force for elections in 2019.

The Council heard that the suggestion of 'Shire Way' for the street name in the Smithfield development had been approved.

There was a plot available for rent in the Gatesheath Allotments; please contact the clerk for further details. The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Monday 6th March at 7.30pm in the Barbour Institute and all residents are invited to attend.
