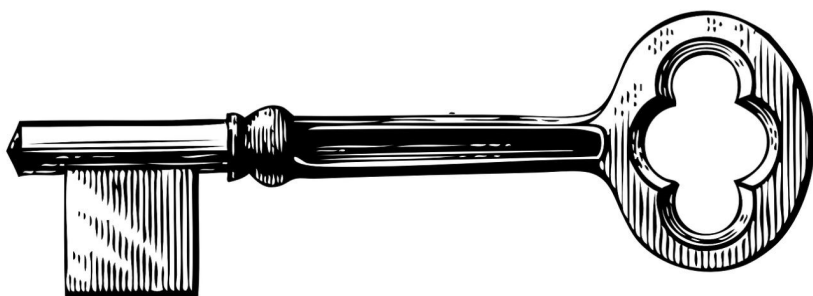

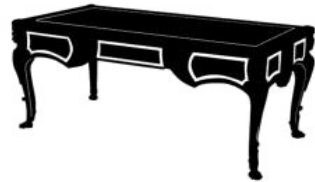

The September meeting of the Parish Council was held in the Barbour Institute.

Before the official business began, members of the public spoke of their concern about the unsatisfactory way in which Tattenhall children had been allocated to bus transport, with some having been given free places while others had to pay. Parents had been lobbying CWaC to look again at its transport policy. There was also concern as to how children were allocated a High School place which could result in pupils who had gone through primary school together being split up, according to whereabouts in Tattenhall they live. The Parish Council would write to CWaC to highlight these concerns.

The Parish Council was asked to give its support to the installation of a defibrillator outside the Spar shop, as currently all the machines in the village were inside buildings. Councillors considered this during the official meeting and agreed to support the project. The First Responders would continue to maintain all of the defibrillators in the village, as they did at present.

Items from the Agenda included: **An update on the Community Land Trust.**

At the next Board meeting, it was anticipated that a planning application would be approved for submission by the Parish Council to CWaC.

Talks were being held with Equity Housing in the hope that a partnership could be formed with them as the social housing provider for the development.

An extension had been granted by CWaC as grant funding had not been spent within the required time.

Glebe Meadow and Barnfield had now been mown and the Parish Council agreed to work with TWiG to apply for a grant to

restore the HaHa. This would allow animals to graze on the land to keep it in good order.

A report on the **Green Dog Walkers'** scheme had found that there had been a significant reduction in fouling since its introduction. There were now 42 members, with 56 dogs. The very successful **Squirrel Trail** was due to finish on 7th September. It had been very popular with residents and visitors alike and the Community Pride working group would consider whether to renew the scheme next year. The cost to the Parish Council had been minimal, and over £1000 had been raised for the NW Air Ambulance, with more money still to be counted.

A working group had been set up to review the **Neighbourhood Plan**. New Terms of Reference were approved by Councillors at the meeting.

The **War Memorial** plaque would be unveiled on 20th September at 10.30am, with refreshments afterwards at the Village Market. The plaque was removed so that incorrect initials on one name could be amended.

Many residents would know that the **Zip Wire** on the playground had been out of action all summer. An inspection revealed that the posts were incorrectly installed and discussions were ongoing with the manufacturer and the installing contractor to have the work done.

Several Councillors attended a course in play area inspection so that the equipment could be looked at once a week to ensure its safety, and a quarterly official inspection had been approved by the Parish Council.

Draft minutes are available on the Parish Council website or in hard copy on application to the Clerk.

The next meeting will be held on 7th October at 7.30pm in the Barbour Institute.
