Colossians 3:1-2

One year is gone and 2023 is here. As we stand here at the beginning

of a New Year, it is a good time to reflect on the year that is ending and look forward to the year that is soon to begin.

It is also a good time for God's people to take inventory of their walk with the Lord. We should take a very close look at where we are in our relationship with Him. We need to examine ourselves and see where we have been, where we are, and where the Lord wants us to be. This passage gives us the opportunity and the challenge to do just that.

This past year has been difficult as we all tried to come back to what we thought was our normal life after the pandemic.

I am sure you will agree with me that life has never been the same. Most of us struggled to catch up with reality. Some people continued to feel isolated as the fear of the virus has not yet disappeared completely. Some 'businesses have been closed whilst some new ways of purchasing items have been developed. This is not what we thought the new normal would bring, but here we go. The truth of the matter is a lot of the things we did or relied upon in the past will never come back again. We are in a new world order.

It is a new life which we must accept just like we did when we came to Christ. We had to abandon our old habits and start a new life with Him." Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come:

The old has gone, the new is here"! (2 Corinthians 5:17)

As I read these verses, I find that they challenge us to do exactly the same thing. As we look at our lives in the light of these verses we are challenged to retain some things, to release others, and remember the rest. Since we have been raised to a new life in Jesus, we are told to seek those things which are above. In other words, we are told to continually be seeking those things which are above. The second verse builds on that thought by telling us to set our affections on things above not on things on the earth. The word "affections" refers to the mind. We are told here to focus our thoughts on heavenly things, not earthly things. We are to set our minds on the things of God and on the things that bring glory to Him. In our spiritual lives, the same thing is true.

Some things have to be let go. There are some things that try to attach themselves to our lives that are just plain trash. Those things need to be kicked to the curb. Other things simply don't have a place in our lives and those things need to be let go.

May I on behalf of the Churchwardens and all members of our Parochial Church Council wish you all a Happy New Year.





Lent Course 2023 Stations of the Cross

Dates 22nd February23 – 29th March 2023 Venue- St Alban's Community Room Time 6pm-7 pm

The 'Stations of the Cross', also known as 'The Way of The Cross', is a devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on Earth as a man. The Stations of the Cross are most commonly prayed during Lent on Wednesdays and Fridays, and especially on Good Friday – the day of the year upon which the events actually occurred.

The Stations of the Cross are commonly found in churches as a series of 14 small icons, or images. Taken together, the stations are used as a mini pilgrimage,



particularly during Lent, and it reflects the journey of pilgrims following Jesus' actual footsteps in the Holy Land. The Stations help us to 'spiritually connect' with the suffering and death of Jesus; after all, he went through all that pain and suffering to save *us*. During Lent, we will be looking at the Stations of the Cross and reflect on each one of them.

The 14 Stations are as follows:

1.	Jesus is condemned to death	8.	Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem
2.	Jesus accepts the cross	9.	Jesus falls the third time
3.	Jesus fall the first time	10.	Jesus is stripped of His garments
4.	Jesus meets His Mother	11.	Crucifixion: Jesus is nailed to the cross
5.	Simon of Cyrene carries the cross	12.	Jesus dies on the cross
6.	Veronica wipes the face of Jesus	13.	Jesus' body is removed from the cross
7.	Jesus falls the second time	14.	Jesus is placed in the tomb

At the January meeting a resident thanked the Parish Council for the "pretty and impressive" Christmas lights display.

A planning application for 27 holiday lodges and 12 accommodation pods at Tattenhall Marina was discussed. Whilst supporting the need for development of local businesses, the Parish Council had considerable concerns regarding the development scale of this additional traffic. conservation area. on wildlife and the local environment and local infrastructure. Comments would be submitted to Cheshire West and Chester Council (CW&C).

The Parish Council has a programme to replace the wooden stiles on the most popular public footpaths with metal kissing gates. Many of these stiles are broken or unusable and this replacement will also improve access to the paths. Approval from landowners is being sought. A positive meeting was recently held with CW&C who have offered to assist with installation.

The 2023-24 Budget was agreed. Funding for the work of the Parish Council comes from a Precept which is included in the Council Tax charge paid by residents. Given the current pressure on costs that residents have, the Parish Council agreed to restrict the increase in the Precept for the year 2023-24 to 2.5%. The amount paid by residents depends on the Council Tax Band of their property. Band D properties will pay £1.02 per week, up from £1.00.

The Parish Council currently has two vacancies and agreed to hold a drop-in event in the village for anyone considering joining to answer their questions.

All residents are very welcome to attend Parish Council meetings and can raise any issue in the 15 minute Public Participation section at the start of the meeting. Meetings are held on the first Monday of every other month at 7.30pm in the Barbour Institute. The next meeting is on 6th March.

Rebecca Robinson asks:

THE DIGITAL AGE: ARE YOU ASSETS PROTECTED?

Rebecca says – this is a question I am asked a lot. It is perhaps easier for me to respond by breaking the question down into "mini-questions" with corresponding answers. Hopefully this will help!

What exactly are "digital assets"?
The term is broadly defined but can be understood to refer to any information about you or created by you that exists in digital form that is stored online or on computers, smartphones, tablets and any other electronic

Even if you do not bank online, it is likely that you will store photographs of loved ones, personal emails and perhaps music on an electronic device. You may also have social media accounts...the list is non-exhaustive.

device.

Whilst you may have made provision for all other assets, by drawing up a Will or preparing a Lasting Power of Attorney, such provisions may not adequately provide the necessary guidance and structure to deal with digital assets

What could happen if I don't protect my digital assets?

Ensuring protection is key:
There have been high-profile examples of
"fortunes" held digitally having been lost
when the holder died. In December 2018,
Gerald Cotten, CEO of Quadrigacx, Canada's
largest cryptocurrency exchange, died
unexpectedly.

Mr Cotten was the only person who had access to customers' digital wallets. As a result, more than \$135m in customer funds held in safe keeping was lost; forever!

What steps can I take to protect my digital assets?

You should check the terms of your Will (and any connected Letter of Wishes), Lasting Power of Attorney and any express lifetime authorisations to see if they do deal with digital assets – you may wish to seek professional guidance with this. You can also take practical steps to assist those who will have to deal with the administration of your digital assets including: making a list of the assets, such as email addresses, usernames and passwords; keep this safe – save it on to an external hard or flash drive; store a hard copy on the list with your Will and/or Lasting Power of Attorney and keep the list updated whenever usernames or passwords are changed and/or new digital assets are generated.

You can also make sure that you provide clear and comprehensive instructions about each one of your digital assets.


