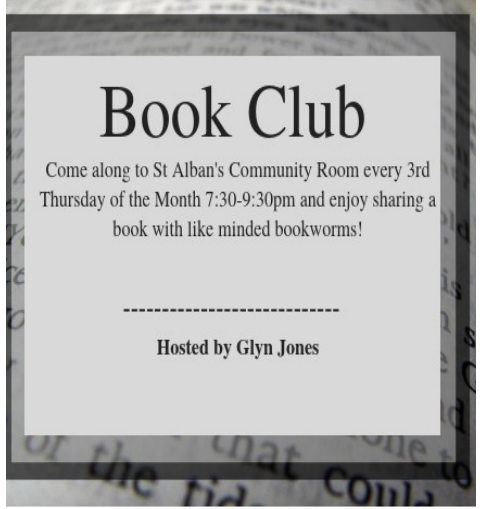

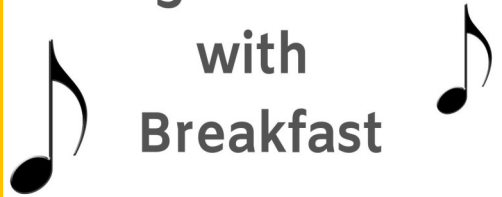

## VE DAY A Service of Remembrance Friday 8<sup>th</sup> May at 2.55pm

During the month of May, we will celebrate the 75th anniversary of Victory in Europe Day with events in communities across the UK, including a three-day event in London.

VE Day, or Victory in Europe Day, marks the day towards the end of World War Two when fighting against Nazi Germany came to an end in Europe. At 3pm on 8 May 1945, Prime Minister Winston Churchill made an announcement on the radio that war in Europe had come to an end.

At the end of the Second World War 3.8 million British men and 400,000 women were demobilised, returning to their homes and families, some for the first time in many years. To this was added tens of thousands of evacuees, the majority of them children, who returned home to town and cities that needed rebuilding. Millions of personnel from Commonwealth forces also faced long journeys back to their homes across the world, whilst over 60 million refugees across the world were left displaced needing to rebuild their lives. These reunions were often joyous, frequently strained and sometimes painful. Resettlement to civilian life was a major concern of post-war governments and a driver of social change in Britain and across the world.

### VE Day in Tattenhall

#### Friday 8<sup>th</sup> May at the Cenotaph at 2.55pm

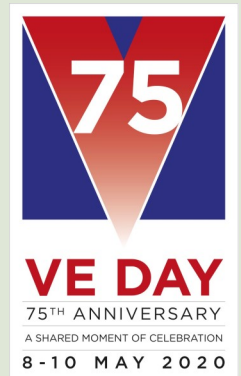
In Tattenhall, the Service of Remembrance will be held at the Cenotaph to mark the 75th anniversary of Victory in Europe Day on 8<sup>th</sup> May at 2.55pm. The Last Post will be played. VE Day 75 events will continue across the weekend.

**At 11am on Saturday 9th May**, cathedrals and churches across the UK will ring their bells in a sign of victory, signifying the end to the years the bells had hung in silence during the Second World War. There will be refreshments in the Barbour Institute after the prayers.

#### Sunday 10th May at 10.30am

Church Services of Celebration and Commemoration Services will take place in cathedrals and churches throughout the UK, Channel Islands and the Isle of Man to celebrate the peace we share today and remember those who lost their lives or returned home dreadfully wounded. The services will also recognise the sacrifices of those who kept the nation fed and the factories, mines and hospitals working during the most challenging of times.

In Tattenhall Church, there will be a **VE Day service of remembrance** in church at **10.30 am** to remember this day and all are invited. We will remember those who lost their lives or returned home dreadfully wounded and pay tribute to those who put their lives on hold at home to keep the nation fed and the factories, mines and hospitals working, many of them not knowing if their loved ones would return home safely.

**Anniversary Celebration of the Family Songs of Praise with Breakfast  
Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> May at 10.30 am**

Last year we launched a new service '**Family Songs of Praise with Breakfast**'. This Breakfast takes place in the Community Hall at 9.15am and at 10.30am; we have our Family Songs of praise in church. These songs are mainly chosen by you the parishioner in advance with a sermon/talk and prayers in the end. After the service, breakfast is again served and we all sit together as a family of God in fellowship. Please note that this is not going to be a Communion Service because it is designed to meet the needs of children as well who can hardly cope with long hours. The service normally takes about 30-40 minutes. All are welcome even if you have never been in church; let this be your first time to come and join in fellowship with us. *"Come, all you who are thirsty, come to the waters; and you who have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without cost". (Isaiah 55:1)*

## **From The Church Calendar**

Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> May **Feast of Augustine**, the first Archbishop of Canterbury.

Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> May **Ascension Day**, an important day in the church year. The Holy Communion will be celebrated at 7.30pm in the Lady Chapel.

Sunday 31st May **Whitsunday**. This is an important day in the calendar and one which, since the abandonment in this country of the Bank Holiday which was once attached to it, has lost its public prominence. All who worship at St Alban's are urged to worship on this day, if at all possible.

Sunday 7th June **Trinity Sunday**, officially called "The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity," is one of the few celebrations of the Christian Year that commemorates a reality and doctrine rather than a person or event. On Trinity Sunday, Christians remember and honour the eternal God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Trinity Sunday is celebrated the Sunday after Pentecost, and lasts only one day, which is symbolic of the unity of the Trinity.

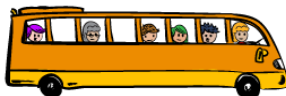

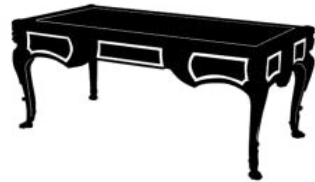

The Parish Council's monthly meeting was held on 2nd March in the Barbour Institute.

During **Public Participation**, PCSO John Hurst brought the meeting up to date with news about burglaries which had happened in February. He also confirmed that the Police would be monitoring parking on Church Bank and would be using SID to enforce the 20mph limit.

The Chair of the Park school PTA and Chair of Governors were present to again request Parish Council funding for drainage to the school field. This item was on the Agenda for Councillors to discuss.

A resident again raised the issue of the flooded roads in and out of Tattenhall and the lack of signage to warn motorists.

Safety on the A41 is an ongoing issue and a resident had written to the authorities to ask that the road be designated a trunk road.

Items of note from the official business were:

### **Planning**

The planning application for affordable housing on the Keysbrook site was discussed and Councillors agreed to expand their comments to CWaC in support of this project;

### **Climate Day**

The March date had been postponed and it was agreed that the event should be held in June to coincide with UN Climate Day.

Speakers would be invited to talk on a range of topics;

### **Community Infrastructure Levy**

CIL is money received from CWaC in relation to new housing built in the Parish. To date the Parish Council had been given £15435 to be spent on community projects.

The Park school had requested part or all of this month to be used for drainage of the school field.

Following discussion it was agreed that the school should receive 10% of the total sum, in proportion to the number of children attending the school to the population of Tattenhall.

### **Highways Matters**

There was some considerable discussion about

the various issues: flooding; speed restrictions; parking; junctions at Harding Avenue/Park Avenue; and footway improvements. Full details can be found in the Parish Council minutes of the meeting.

### **Youth Council**

Five young people, from school years 6 to 8, had expressed an interest. Councillors would meet with them to discuss how to attract others and how they could be involved in the Climate Day.

### **The Spinney**

Meetings had taken place around creating a Tattenhall Nature Park and opening up the Spinney to the public while protecting wildlife. The first step would be to commission an ecological survey of the Spinney.

### **Community Pride**

The working group had put some plans in place for the VE Day event (more details elsewhere in the magazine).

### **Community Safety**

The Emergency Plan had been reviewed and a draft would be submitted to CWaC. As it had now been approved by the Parish Council. Roles were assigned with Iain Keeping taking the lead as Emergency Controller.

### **Neighbourhood Plan Review**

The working group had met to consider the monitoring review of the policies in the NP.

### **High Street Bunting**

It was agreed to install the brackets for the bunting using the grant which had been obtained for this purpose. It was hoped that support for putting up and taking down bunting could be found through the Business Alliance.

### **Village Maintenance**

A number of quotes had been received and these would be evaluated at the next Parish Council Meeting in April.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on 6th April at 7.30pm in the Barbour Institute. All residents are welcome to attend.

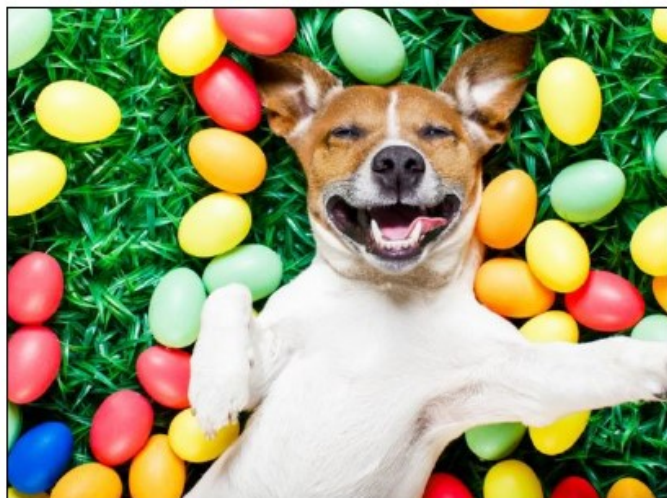

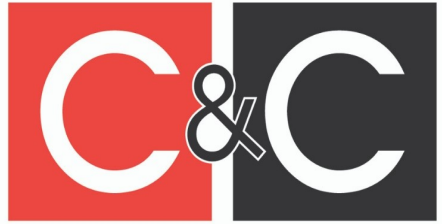

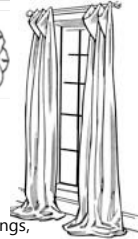
